 - Status Quo School System


Changes Based on House Bill 502

- Status Quo is now Title 20/ No Waivers School System (NWSS)

Strategic Waivers School System/IE² Accountability



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ALL SCHOOLS: CCRPI

- On CCRPI, without the inclusion of Challenge Points, the school shall annually increase by 3% of the gap between the baseline year CCRPI score and 100
 - -The baseline year will be 2015-16
 - -This baseline year applies to districts entering contracts effective in both 2015-16 and 2016-17

Strategic Waivers School System/IE² Accountability



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ALL SCHOOLS: CCRPI (continued)

 Example 1: Assume a school's baseline CCRPI without Challenge Points is 60.0

-Gap between baseline and 100: 100 - 60 = 40

-3% of 40 = 1.2 points = annual increase from the baseline

-Five-Year Targets = 61.2, 62.4, 63.6, 64.8, 66.0

Strategic Waivers School System/IE² Accountability ALL SCHOOLS: CCRPI (continued)



- Schools with initial CCRPI scores in the top quartile of the state within each grade cluster will be required to maintain or improve that level of performance
- Targets for schools that reach this threshold in any year will remain at that same threshold

Strategic Waivers School System/IE² Accountability



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ALL SCHOOLS: CCRPI (continued)

 Example 2: Assume a school's baseline CCRPI without Challenge Points is 84.2 and the top quartile is 81.5 (not actual numbers)

-The school must remain in the top quartile, continually working to improve its CCRPI

Strategic Waivers School System/IE² Accountability



- Per O.C.G.A. 20-2-82(e), the goal for each waiver and variance shall be improvement of student performance
- Requested waivers must include at least one of the "Big Four" waivers of state class size, expenditure control, certification, or salary schedule requirements

Exhibit B: Flexibility Component



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Important Principles of SWSS/IE² Flexibility

- Prohibition on using flexibility to enhance Quality Basic Education (QBE) funding
- Benefit of waiving laws instead of rules except in cases where rules are directly cited
- Importance of local policy manuals and student handbooks as prevailing governance sources
- Non-waivers by law and related contract provisions-O.C.G.A. Section 20-2-82(e)

Exhibit B: Flexibility Component



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Under O.C.G.A. § 20-2-80 and SBOE Rule 160-5-1-.33, the School District is seeking flexibility for all its schools from the following state statutes and associated rules in exchange for greater accountability (as outlined in the IE2 Partnership Contract) over the life of a five-year contract which allows for six years of flexibility between the School District Board of Education and the Georgia State Board of Education, except as prohibited in O.C.G.A. § 20-2-82(e).

O.C.G.A. §20-2-82(e)



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 The state board shall not be authorized to waive or approve variances on any federal, state, and local rules, regulations, court orders, and statutes relating to civil rights; insurance; the protection of the physical health and safety of school students, employees, and visitors; conflicting interest transactions; the prevention of unlawful conduct; any laws relating to unlawful conduct in or near a public school; any reporting requirements pursuant to Code Section 20-2-320 (Comprehensive educational information network) or Chapter 14 of this title (GOSA); the requirements of Code Section 20-2-211.1 (Clearance Checks by PSC); or the requirements in subsection (c) of Code Section 20-2-327 (Individual graduation plans)

- QBE Financing except to the extent it relates to funding (O.C.G.A. § 20-2-161)

2015-2016 Strategic Waivers School System/IE² Application



- School systems seeking a Strategic Waivers School System contract for 2015-2016 must have their contracts approved by the December 2015 State Board Meeting
- Individual school system waiver requests for 2015-2016 must also be received by November 1, 2015 to allow State Board of Education consideration at their December 10 meeting

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The SBOE shall mandate the loss of governance of one or more of an IE² System's nonperforming schools...Such loss of governance may include, *but shall not be limited to:*

- Conversion a school to charter status with independent school level governance and a governance board with strong parental involvement;
- Operation of a school by a successful school system, as defined by GOSA, and pursuant to funding criteria established by the SBOE; or
- Operation of a school by a private entity, nonprofit or for profit, pursuant to a request for proposals issued by the Department.



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In addition to the loss of governance options specified in the statute that could be imposed at the end of the IE² contract term, the following options for loss of governance could be implemented *during or at the conclusion of* the IE² contract term. Note that the numbering continues from the list above

- Nonperforming schools could have governance reduced by being required to submit a remedial action plan for LBOE approval before the school can implement necessary changes
 - For this option, the District could specify the general requirements such a plan a must meet or let the school submit a draft based on its own analysis



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5.The school could be required to make leadership and faculty/staff changes, including replacing leaders/faculty/ staff and/or an aggressive professional development program

6.The school could be required to implement reconstitution if necessary to ensure performance improvements

7.The school could be required to develop individual student achievement plans and implement programs such as afterschool and/or Saturday tutoring programs that provide additional time on task in subject areas specified in the individual plans



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8.Other options for loss of governance not listed above that address the specific reasons for a school's failure to meet its targets could be proposed in an IE² application

Overview of the SWSS/ IE² Application Process



- There are two main parts to the SWSS/IE² application process
 - 1. Preparing and submitting your application
 - Georgia Department of Education (GaDOE) and Governor's Office of Student Achievement (GOSA) review and SBOE approval of your application

Preparing and submitting your SWSS/IE² application

- 8. Exhibit E: Elementary School Plan(s)
- 9. Exhibit F: Middle School Plan(s)
- 10. Exhibit G: High School Plan(s)

Preparing and submitting your SWSS/IE² application



- The SWSS/IE² Application Packet includes 10 items:
 - 1. Completed Application Form
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 - 4. Exhibit A: Strategic Plan
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- When finalized, these 8 pieces make up your SWSS/IE² Contract
- You create all 8 using template files we provide

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ASSURANCES FORM AND SIGNATURE SHEET

 The law requires your school district to provide assurances that it will do certain things and comply with certain laws. This Assurance Form enumerates all of these requirements and, when you submit this signed Signature Sheet with this Assurance Form as part of your SWSS/IE² System Application Package, you are providing the legal assurance that your SWSS/IE² system understands and will do these things. This form must be signed by a duly authorized representative of the school system.



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EXHIBITS

- Signed local Board of Education resolution approving the creation of the SWSS/IE² system.
- Notice that was sent to each principal within the proposed SWSS/IE² system regarding required hearings on the SWSS/IE² system application.
- 3. A list of all schools to be included in the SWSS/IE² system, including new schools or college and career academies that will be formed throughout the life of the SWSS/IE², with an indication of which existing schools are currently in Needs Improvement status.
- 4. School plans using the template found on our website at <u>http://www.gadoe.org/External-Affairs-and-</u><u>Policy/Policy/Pages/IE2.aspx</u>



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- 5. A brief description of the SWSS/IE² system that includes the name, the mission, grades served, the focus of the curriculum, instructional methods to be used, including any distinctive or unique instructional techniques or educational programs to be employed, and other pertinent information.
- 6. A brief description of the system's fiscal history and whether the system is or has ever operated under a fiscal deficit.
- 7. Online link to the school system's most recent annual audit.
- 8. Online link to the school system's most recent accreditation report.
- 9. Online link to the school system's most recent strategic plan.
