

**Dual Language Immersion Programs** grew by 214 % from 2012 to 2014 in GA. There are currently 14 public schools that offer either Chinese. French, German or Spanish mostly in the 50/50 model which means that students receive 50% of the day content instruction for Math. Science. Social Studies and Literacy in the target language.
