The Georgia Family – Friendly Partnership School Awards are annual awards that recognize Title I schools for their exceptional commitment to fostering welcoming environments that encourage families to become active partners in improving student achievement and success.

2015 Award Application Packet


The Georgia Department of Education (GaDOE) launched the Georgia Family – Friendly Partnership School initiative in the summer of 2010 to assist Title I schools, families and communities in working together to create welcoming environments that lead to increased student achievement. A welcoming environment increases family engagement which, in turn, helps students earn better grades, graduate from high school and enroll in post-secondary education. This award takes the initiative a step further by recognizing Title I schools that have gone above and beyond to create an environment where families and community members feel they belong, and in turn, play an important role in supporting their school's student success.

The following four factors should be considered when assessing a school's welcoming environment:

1. Physical Environment

The physical appearance of the school building and surrounding areas such as the main entrance, halls, parking lots, signage and landscaping.

2. Personal Contact

The visible interactions between school staff and families and/or community members, such as acknowledging parents or guests in the school, friendly greetings from front office staff, or public recognition for parents and community members who volunteer and contribute to school and student success.

3. Communication

The way that the school keeps families and the community informed through sources such as a welcome letter, up-to-date school calendar of events and holidays, a staff directory, announcements on social media Websites or a school map for visitors. Information for parents should be provided in various languages and should be easy to understand.

4. School Practices and Policies

The opportunity for families and community members to provide feedback, actively contribute by serving on committees that address policies and procedures, or participate in parent organizations that are inclusive of the entire school community.

Eligibility

To be considered for the Georgia Family – Friendly Partnership School Award, a school must meet the following requirements:

- The school must be identified as a schoolwide Title I school.
- The school must not be designated as a Priority School or Focus School under the Georgia Waiver for ESEA Requirements.
- The school was not Family-Friendly Partnership School Award Finalist in the previous year.
- The school may not have been a Family-Friendly Partnership School Award recipient within the last five years.

Selection Process

All Title I schools that meet eligibility requirements are invited to apply by submitting a complete application packet according to the application guidelines. A panel of respected educators, parents, and community members from across the state will assess the applications and select up to twenty finalists.

School principals will be notified of their schools' selection in December, and the judges will conduct school site visits between January and April 2015. Site visits are not announced in advance. During the site visits, judges will conduct a surprise walk-through and interview school staff and visitors to assess the school's welcoming environment. Following the school visits, the judges will decide on the 2015 Georgia Family-Friendly Partnership Schools. Up to ten schools may be honored with the award each year. Winners will be notified by formal letter and phone call in either April or May of 2015.

Finalists are selected based on the written application only. Once a school is designated a finalist, the scoring process starts over and winners will be determined solely on the school visit and interview process.

Winners

Schools that are honored with the Georgia Family – Friendly Partnership School Award will be designated as a Family – Friendly School by the Georgia Department of Education for five years from the date the award is announced. In addition to holding this title of distinction, each winning school will also receive:

- A letter of recognition from the State School Superintendent
- A press release from the GaDOE that may be shared with local media
- A banner or plaque recognizing the school's accomplishment
- A Welcome Mat to place at the front entrance of the school identifying it as a Family – Friendly Partnership School
- A special recognition in the Georgia Family – Friendly Partnership School Award spotlight publication which will feature stories and promising practices from the finalists and winners
- A special professional learning opportunity provided by The Ritz-Carlton Leadership Center

Finalists

Schools that are named Georgia Family – Friendly Partnership School finalists, but that do not win the award will receive the option for specialized support from the Georgia Association of Educators to further develop the welcoming environments in their schools and to increase their chances of winning the award in the future.

Application Guidelines

The application begins on page six and can be completed in the pdf document. Please read the completion and submission guidelines carefully, as incomplete applications will not be accepted.

1) Complete the application ensuring attention to the following items:

- A) School Information – must be completed and typed on the application where indicated.
- B) School Data – must be completed and typed on the application where indicated. Please note that one percentage for “meets and exceeds” is requested for all grades per test content area. Primary schools should fill out the attendance data and substitute GKIDS scores for CRCT data.
- C) Family – Friendly Partnership School Parent Survey Information – must be completed and typed on the application where indicated. The Family – Friendly Partnership School Parent Survey is available in English and Spanish on the GaDOE’s Website. Please note **this is the only Parent Survey that will be accepted for this section**. Look for the parent survey link on the right hand side of the page at:

- D) Short Answer - must answer both questions completely and type responses directly on the application in the space provided. Please limit your answers to the number of words and font specifications listed.
- E) Attachments – must attach a copy of your School Title I Parental Involvement Policy. Please also note that up to five extra points may be awarded if a video/pictures of your school’s welcoming environment is/are submitted. Pictures and video must be submitted online at:

- F) Essay – must complete the essay directly on the application in the space provided. Please note the instructions for font and spacing.

 - C) Permission is granted for any parts of the application or attached materials to be shared with persons interested in promoting the Georgia Family – Friendly Partnership School Awards Program or to be used in educational publications from the GaDOE.
- 4) To be eligible for the 2015 Georgia Family – Friendly Partnership School Awards, **the completed 2015 application packet, as specified in the application guidelines, must be received on or before 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, November 13, 2014.****

Families and school staff collaborate with community members to connect students, families and staff to expanded learning opportunities, community services and civic participation.
