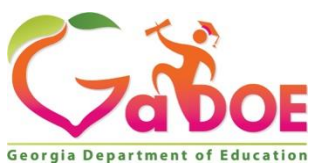

Accessibility Resources

Communication Tips

- Ensure effective communication. This is key! Checking in regularly with your special needs students is essential, whether it be via phone, email, text or synchronous session.
- Ensure all communication going out to students is clear, concise, all-encompassing, well thought out, and free of typos and errors.
- Encourage students to reach out for help. Establish a way for students to get timely and accurate answers to their questions so they are not held up for long periods of time while they are trying to work independently.
- Use personalized communication regularly. Group communication is appropriate in many instances, however, personalize your communication whenever possible. This is especially true when it applies to special needs students with differing situations or requirements.
- Provide timely feedback.

Auditory Resources

- Free text-to-speech options which may be great choices to read webpages, documents, and more.
- **Apple OS X Resources**
 - [Mac OS X Text to Speech](#) is the built-in text-to-speech accessibility feature in Mac OS X. You can simply highlight the text you want read and press a button once the feature is enabled. If you are a Mac user and want more information on text-to-speech, please visit the [Mac OS X Accessibility site](#).
 - [Mac OS X Voiceover](#) is a screen reader built into the Mac operating system which provides auditory descriptions of onscreen elements.
- **Microsoft Windows & PC Resources**
 - [Microsoft Windows Narrator](#) is an accessibility feature built into your Microsoft Windows operating system to hear on screen text read aloud.
 - [Balabolka](#) can be downloaded to a PC to read a wide variety of text files. Another feature is that it can save the audio format for multiple viewings.

 - [Announcify](#) can be downloaded for Android and Chrome users as an add-on. It reads out loud any website you want.

Dictation Resources

- Speech-to-text resources are available in your computer's operating system or in many applications you commonly use on your computer, including Microsoft Office applications. Dictation (speech-to-text) allows you to speak and your computer will convert your speech to text.

 - a flexible work schedule, allowing for students to take more time to complete work each day
 - opportunities for differentiated instruction based on a variety of learning styles

 - ability to work in a quiet environment with limited distractions
 - review activities, study guides, and notes are integrated into the course content
 - ability to use course content, resources, and self-checks as needed to complete and prepare for graded assignments and assessments
