Charter Schools in Georgia

Georgia's first charter school law was passed in 1993. It allowed for the creation of conversion charter schools only. Conversion charter schools are charter schools that existed as a local school prior to becoming a charter school. The first three conversion charter schools were approved in 1995. The charter school law was expanded in 1998, allowing for both locally-approved, a charter school that did not exist as a local school prior to becoming a charter school, and state chartered special schools, a school whose creation is authorized pursuant to Article VIII, Section V, Paragraph VII of the Georgia Constitution. Oglethorpe Charter School was the first locally approved start-up charter school. It opened in the Savannah-Chatham County School System and is still operating today. In 2001, the first two state chartered special schools opened, Charter Conservatory for Liberal Arts and Technology (CCAT) - now Statesboro STEM Academy and Odyssey School, which added Georgia's first virtual school -- the Georgia Cyber Academy - as a program in 2007. In 2008, the charter law was changed to establish the Georgia Charter Schools Commission, with the first Commission schools opening in 2009. In 2012 a constitutional amendment was approved by Georgia voters to allow for a new State Charter Schools Commission (SCSC). A state charter school is a school that is authorized by the commission pursuant to Article 31A in the Official Code of Georgia whose creation was authorized pursuant to Article VIII, Section V, Paragraph VII of the Georgia Constitution. In 2010, the General Assembly established the "Building Resourceful Individuals to Develop Georgia's Economy Act", within this act college and career academies were established. In 2016 a college and career academy was defined as a specialized school established as a charter school or pursuant to a contract for a strategic waivers school system or charter system, which formalizes a partnership that demonstrates a collaboration between business, industry, and community stakeholders to advance work force development between one or more local boards of education, a private individual, a private organization, or a state or local public entity in cooperation with one or more postsecondary institutions.

2019-20 Charter Schools

There are 110 charter schools in Georgia for the 2019-20 school year. There are 7 conversion charter schools, including 2 that are college and career academies. There are 71 locally approved start-up charter schools, including 19 that are college and career academies. Finally, there are 22 state charter schools, which are authorized by the State Charter Schools Commission.





Charter School Contract Performance Targets

Background

The Every Student Succeeds Act, commonly referred to as ESSA, was signed into law in 2015. ESSA, which earned bipartisan approval in Congress, freed states from their No Child Left Behind (NCLB) waiver agreements and entrusted them with the responsibility to develop their own state plans to support education. ESSA significantly scaled back the authority of the U.S. Secretary of Education and U.S. Department of Education. The requirements of the law vary in specificity from issue to issue, with significant flexibility granted in some areas while in others (such as testing), many of the federal requirements introduced in No Child Left Behind remain.

The Every Student Succeeds Act gave Georgia an opportunity to *reflect on* and *refine* previous education reforms and engage Georgians in a meaningful way to chart out the future of education in our state – together.

In creating Georgia's ESSA State Plan, the State sought out maximum flexibility while creating a cohesive and aligned plan that is responsive to the feedback received from educators, parents, students, business/industry representatives, and community members. The resulting plan strongly supports Georgia's vision of offering a holistic education to each and every child in the state.


This plan captures the Georgia Department of Education's shifting role from one focused on *compliance* to one focused on *service* and *support*. It defines the Department's shared responsibility to expand opportunities and increase outcomes for students, in partnership with other state agencies, nonprofit and civic organizations, districts, schools, and communities. This plan supports the alignment of tools, resources, initiatives, programs, and efforts so they work in a more effective and efficient way to ultimately impact the classroom. The cornerstones of Georgia's plan are *strengthening the teaching profession* and *building the capacity of leaders through quality feedback, support, mentorship, and professional learning*.

GaDOE redesigned the accountability system, including CCRPI, to reflect the new goals of Georgia's new ESSA State Plan. The redesigned CCRPI was introduced for the 2017-18 school year. Because of this redesign, the District Flexibility and Charter Schools Division is working on a revised set of charter system performance measures. Until these measures are finalized, the division report presents only CCRPI scores. When the updated performance measures are approved, the District Flexibility and Charter Schools Division will update the report to reflect the update.


Given the two major changes in CCRPI since it was first introduced, CCRPI for the three years 2012-2014 are comparable to each other, and CCRPI for the three years 2015-2017 are also comparable to each other. The new redesigned CCRPI for 2018 as presented in the Georgia ESSA State Plan begins a new period of comparability. While the graphs and tables below show a time series of CCRPI from 2012 through 2019, the different comparability periods are typically separated by blank column in charts and by a vertical line in graphs.

Georgia Charter School CCRPI Scores

While the charter school CCRPI score has not been higher than the state, they did have a substantial increase between 2018 and 2019, while the overall state score decreased.


