The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) places a 1.0% statewide cap on student participation in alternate assessments. In March 2022, the U.S. Department of Education approved a one-year waiver from this cap for Georgia for 2021-2022. (See [accountability](#), ESSA, *2022 Georgia's 1% Alternate Assessment Waiver Approval Letter*.) As required by the approved waiver, the Georgia Department of Education (GaDOE) worked with districts during the 2021-2022 school year and continues to work with districts in the 2022-2023 school year to ensure that the Georgia Alternate Assessment (GAA) 2.0 is used to assess only those students with the most significant cognitive disabilities.

Though district participation is not capped at 1%, districts that exceeded the 1% cap in 2021-2022 were required to provide justification to GaDOE. Districts could choose from six standard justifications. Those justifications are provided in the Excel worksheet that follows. As required by ESSA, the justifications are posted on the GaDOE website.
