Policy Update

Proposed Amendment to Statewide Passing Score SBOE Rule

The State Board of Education approved the posting, for 30 days of public comment, of a proposed amendment to SBOE Rule 160-4-2-.13 Statewide Passing Score that would change the percentage requirement of the numeric score on the Georgia Milestones EOC assessment on a student's final numeric grade in the course assessed by the EOC to a minimum of 10%, from the current percentage requirement of 20%. The SBOE is expected to vote on adoption of this amendment at its July meeting. Additional information and a public comment opportunity is available here.

Mathematics Assessment Waiver for 2023-2024

The State Board of Education approved a waiver of promotion requirements for grades 5 and 8 and EOC course grade requirements for mathematics for the 2023-2024 school year. With the implementation of new math standards and assessments, we will have to hold standard setting meetings next summer. This means score reporting for mathematics will be delayed to late summer/early fall 2024 and will not be available in time for promotion decisions and course grades. Keenville

Due to a recent reduction in the state testing budget, we will unfortunately have to discontinue the Keenville formative assessment program. 2023-2024 will be the last full administration of Keenville as a formative assessment system. During this coming year we will transition Keenville to an instructional resource. As an instructional resource, the Keenville games will continue to be available to students and educators, but back-end systems that we cannot maintain without external support (logins, dashboards, score reporting etc.) will no longer be available. The instructional resource version of Keenville will be available beginning with the 2024-2025 school year.


Assessment Update

Superintendent's Test Certification

The Superintendent's Test Certification completion is due by Monday, July 31, for all assessments, including GKIDS 2.0, ACCESS for ELs, Alternate ACCESS, GAA 2.0, and Georgia Milestones. System Test Coordinators (STCs) must complete the Superintendent's Test Certification form in the MyGaDOE Portal.

- 1. Open the Superintendent's Test Certification Form.
- 2. Click **Add New Record** to open and complete the form.
- Click Submit. A notice will automatically be sent to the superintendent in the MyGaDOE Portal to Approve or Reject the submission.
- 4. Once the superintendent has approved the form, the process is complete.

The Superintendent's Test Certification User Guide is available in the top right-hand corner of the application in the MyGaDOE Portal.




New System Test Coordinator Assignment

The Assessment Division has begun to receive notices of changes in personnel holding the role of STC/ Assessment Director for local districts. The *Student Assessment Handbook* provides the specific protocols for assigning STCs (p. 18).

Due to the confidential nature of student information, assignment of the role of STC (otherwise known as Assessment Director) must be made by the superintendent of the district or state charter school through the local security officer in the MyGaDOE Portal and in the **Primary Role Management (PRM)** application (<u>User Guide</u>) also found in the MyGaDOE Portal. The security officer must include a primary and/or secondary Assessment Director in this application

identifying the full name and email address for both individuals. This assignment allows the STC to receive data files and emails from the K12 Assessment Director listserv.



Once a new STC has been identified in the Primary Role Management application, GaDOE Assessment Specialists send a notice to vendors regarding the appointment of the STC to ensure new accounts are created in online assessment platforms for district and school management and monitoring of assessments.

A role request must be made by the security officer in the MyGaDOE Portal allowing access to the STC for the following **assessment forms**:

- Testing Irregularity Form (TIF)
- Rescore Request
- Superintendent Test Certification (Edit)
- Special Accommodations Request

2023-2024 Student Assessment Handbook

The 2023-2024 Student Assessment Handbook has been posted to the For System Test Coordinators site STCs are directed to the Table of Changes (p. 247) for specific references to additions or edits made to the handbook. In addition, the State Assessment Training – Part 1 GaDOE-hosted webinar will focus directly on understanding assessment policies and protocols found in the Student Assessment Handbook.

Georgia Assessment and Training Calendar

The 2023-2024 Georgia Assessment and Training calendar has been posted on the <u>For System Test Coordinators</u> site. This calendar includes all test administration windows and training sessions.

All assessment-specific training registration links are found in *GaDOE Professional Learning Events*. Sessions are listed each month in the Assessment Update. STCs must review the upcoming trainings to determine the

need to forward to appropriate personnel such as Technology Coordinators, Special Education Coordinators, and ESOL Coordinators.

STC Training Memorandum of the New Assessment Training Plan Posted

Each school year, the Office of Assessment and Accountability provides various test administration trainings to STCs for all state assessments. Notification to STCs is by memorandum found on the Georgia Student Assessment Program website, For System Test Coordinators link that is posted annually. In addition, announcement of all training sessions is found in the monthly Assessment Update newsletters posted on the same link. All STCs are required to attend the mandatory webinars noted in the calendar found in the memorandum as well as on the Georgia Assessment and Training Calendar posted on the website. Attendance will be recorded and collected for all sessions.

Asynchronous courses provided through Georgia Learns must be completed annually by STCs, SchTCs, Test Examiners, and Proctors. Staff will receive a completion badge and certificate once they have completed the course successfully. STCs and SchTCs are responsible for collecting documentation of all Georgia Learns course completion certificates from staff and educators prior to any test administration windows and beginning any test sessions.

STCs and SchTCs are instructed to clearly document attendance at all local training sessions and include agendas and supporting presentations and/or handouts with specific guidance and policy related to test security and assessment administration protocols. Training must include a review of Examiner's Manuals and define and clarify test security breaches and potential opportunities for irregularities and invalidations. Local training must clearly articulate the process and procedure for reporting irregularities for review by the STC and subsequent reporting to the Office of Assessment and Accountability for review.

Georgia Milestones and DRC BEACON Assessment System Multiple Student Upload Change

In the June Assessment Update, we reported that MSU uploads in 2023-2024 will include Free or Reduced-Price Meal (FRPL) eligibility status for each student. Because the addition of FRPL Eligibility status to the MSU may require STCs to work with other internal teams (e.g.,Data Collections and SIS Coordinators), we wanted to provide a few details that can support this collaboration.

- The MSU pulls student data from the SIS. This means the student FRPL eligibility data will need to be available in the SIS prior to MSU generation.
- Because FRPL eligibility statuses may change during the year, the SIS will need to be updated with the most current FRPL eligibility data several times a year, before the MSU uploads for each test administration.
- All students are required to have an FRPL eligibility value in the MSU; missing/blank values for the FRPL eligibility field are not allowed. The acceptable values are listed in the June Assessment Update.
- For school systems who utilize DRC BEACON in early fall, the new MSU will be used.

Note that the definitions and acceptable values for the FRPL eligibility field are the same as those that will be used for Data Collections' Student Record collection for SY2023-2024. We have notified the SIS vendors of the change to the MSU and requested that the updated MSU file be ready for school systems by August 2023. We are currently working with DRC to add *FRPL Eligibility* to Student Management in DRC INSIGHT.

We are excited about this change because it will allow us to report achievement for the Economically Disadvantaged/Not Economically Disadvantaged subgroups with assessment results. We appreciate your assistance in making it successful — we can't do it without you! At the start of the school year, STCs are encouraged to reach out to their Data Collections colleagues to discuss if any internal processes or schedules are needed to facilitate FRPL eligibility data collection and incorporation of these data into the SIS and MSU. Test Development

Mathematics Standards Revision

Georgia's K-12 Mathematics Standards will be implemented beginning in the 2023-2024 school year. The 2023-2024 tests will align to the new standards beginning Winter 2023. The EOC Fall Mid-Month assessments will be aligned to the GSE and intended for students completing GSE Algebra I and GSE Coordinate Algebra. These will be the last administrations of the Algebra I EOC and Coordinate Algebra EOC.

There will be a single <u>Algebra: Concepts and Connections</u> EOC associated with the new standards starting in Winter 2023. See <u>Secondary Pathways Guidance</u>.

The No-calculator section (Section 1, Part A) has been eliminated in the revised test design beginning Winter 2023.



Planning for 2023-2024


DRC BEACON When making district plans for the upcoming school year, DRC BEACON is a great way to measure achievement and growth throughout the school year. BEACON reports give teachers actionable information to plan for differentiated instruction, create interventions, and monitor progress. In addition, BEACON will continue to provide estimated performance in ELA on the end-of-grade Georgia Milestones assessment. Due to the implementation of the new K-12 Mathematics standards, projected mathematics performance for Georgia Milestones end-of-grade assessment for the 2023-2024 school year.

Districts have flexibility in determining how best to utilize BEACON. Two possible options for implementation include:

1. Teachers can utilize domain-specific testlets between instruction to assess learning as frequently as needed, allowing progress monitoring. Additionally, they can support students who may need remediation or acceleration individually or in small groups within the classroom.



2. Teachers can administer complete content area assessments 2-3 times per year to track student understanding and progress. They can utilize this data to adjust instruction as it is occurring.



Teachers can combine the two approaches to work in individual or small group testlets between full cycles, as needed, to provide remediation or acceleration.



Formative Instructional Practices (FIP)

Plan for Assessment Literacy Professional Learning



Dr. Sandra Herbst, former superintendent in British Columbia, developed three sections for learning-based faculty meetings: For Learning (L), For Discussion (D), For Information (I). This structure engages faculty members in learning about a practice that is important for professional growth and/or grade and departmental growth for a brief, but important, period of time. The learning together topic for meeting is identified based on observed needs for student learning improvement. Then comes discussion time, followed by information time, and both add value to improving the professional practice area.

So, how might Georgia leaders apply Dr. Herbst's approach to formative assessment literacy? An example of a formative assessment literacy learning activity that has an embedded learning topic could be a "view and note" protocol. Teachers study samples of previously

assessed student work and note their observations. The work is redacted of personally identifiable information and is for the same standard and task. The purpose is to learn, discuss observations and determine if new information is needed. Leaders provide probing questions for teachers to respond to during the "view and note" period. What consistencies do I see regarding how teachers assessed student work (L)? Do I see variation (L)? What does this mean (L)? Am I comfortable and confident with what I see as being good for students (D)? Are there differences in assessment that actually make a difference for students (D)? Are there other ways to approach assessment that would be better for students, improve their work, and communicate with parents more effectively (I)? Next, teachers view the work independently and note their thinking about the questions for use during discussion time. For information time, leaders provide several brief articles or blog posts for teachers to read that directly respond to the probing questions and learning topic. For accountability, teachers can share what they learned from reading and identify one practice to try to improve classroom formative assessment use. In a couple of weeks, teachers share updates and evidence about changes in their classrooms and make further decisions.

Leaders know that the pathway to any significant change process builds towards what Malcolm Gladwell described as a *tipping point*. Edgar Albert Guest described it this way... "At first, they said it couldn't be done, but some were doing it. Then they said, only a special few could do it. But more were doing it. Then they said, *Why would we do it any other way*?" In these challenging times in K-12 public education, leaders may desire to add more choices to their professional learning toolbox. The three-section learning protocol is one retooling option.

New WIDA Alternate ACCESS Assessment



Thanks to the efforts of Georgia teachers and other educators



across the WIDA consortium, the new Alternate ACCESS assessment will be administered in 2023-2024. The new assessment integrates the WIDA ELD Standards Framework, 2020 Edition, and covers kindergarten, which is part of the new K-2 grade-level cluster. Since 2023-2024 is the first year the new Alternate ACCESS test will be administered to students, WIDA must conduct a standard-setting event in July 2024. During standard setting, educators will review test content, examine performance data, and set cut scores for each achievement level. WIDA will then present cut score recommendations to the WIDA Executive Committee for approval in August 2024. STCs and SchTCs should keep the answers to the following questions in mind when they are discussing the impact of these changes with their ESOL colleagues:

When will the WIDA Alternate ACCESS Test Examiner Course be available for Test Examiners?

The new WIDA Alternate ACCESS training course will go live on Friday, September 1.

When will the new WIDA Alternate ACCESS test be administered and the resulting scores posted?

The WIDA Alternate ACCESS window opens Wednesday, January 10, 2024 and closes Friday, March 1, 2024 (same for WIDA ACCESS). Resulting scores will be delayed due to standard setting. The 2023-2024 WIDA Alternate ACCESS scores will be released in WIDA AMS in the Fall of 2024.

After the standard-setting event takes place, how will educators and families learn that scores have changed?

- For educators: WIDA will create a public webpage that includes a timeline of events, standard setting infographic, hosted webinar, and a communications toolkit for districts.
- For families: WIDA will post updated versions of WIDA Alternate ACCESS: Understanding Your Child's Scores, a new guide for understanding test items, and a flyer for families about delayed scores on the WIDA webpage.

WIDA AMS and DRC INSIGHT Updates for 2023-2024

Beginning Friday, June 30, educators will see changes in the student and test management applications, new locations for score reports, and a new way to import student data. STCs and SchTCs can:

- View all student demographic details in one tab, and quickly move to the next tab to edit accommodations in the new student management application.
- Review, edit, and create new registrations on a refreshed test management interface.
- Easily move between applications with clearly identifiable buttons, and readily identify choices to print test tickets and run tier placement reports.

The GAA 2.0 transitioned from a paper-pencil assessment to one that includes real-time online response entry in 2023, with students viewing test



To understand the ease of this transition for test examiners, the Assessment Department published a five-item survey, with three close-ended and two open-ended items, in the May Assessment Update Newsletter. Approximately 228 test examiners completed the survey by the Friday, May 19 deadline.

Final Score Reporting for Spring Administration



Summary reporting for spring EOG is underway and is scheduled to begin in July for spring EOC. Note the updates to the reporting locations in the chart. Please be reminded that summary data (i.e., school, system, and state results) are embargoed until results are officially released by GaDOE in mid-to-late July.

Final ISRs, Class Rosters, and system data files will include SGP data and will be available in July. Note that updated system data file layouts (in .txt and .xlsx versions) are now available in Report Delivery. The updated layouts include minor revisions to the names and lengths of the SGP fields. These updates have no impact on the spring preliminary and EOG retest data files that you have already received.

As a reminder, the last day for teachers to see their students' scores on the interactive reporting system is Friday, July 14. STCs and SchTCs will have no change to their access and permissions on the system, however STCs should review the roles of district and school personnel starting Tuesday, August 1 and make updates as needed.


STCs Inactivating Users

As a reminder, throughout the year, STCs are responsible for ensuring the district and school user accounts are accurate within the DRC INSIGHT platform. Therefore, when district and school staff leave your district, STCs must inactivate their DRC INSIGHT account to prevent them from logging into the system. To inactivate a user, log into the DRC INSIGHT platform, and select **User Management**. From the **Edit User** tab, use the various drop-down menus and fields to enter search criteria to locate the user and select **Find User**. Once you have located the user, click the inactivate icon in the action column. When the inactivate user dialog box displays, select Inactivate to make the user inactive.

EOC Winter 2023 Enrollment Count

The EOC Winter 2023 Enrollment Count window opens Monday, August 7, and closes Friday, August 18 for all districts planning to administer Winter 2023 EOCs. STCs must enter specific assessment dates for each test as the entire state window date range is no longer acceptable.

Enhanced Student Experience Highlights


Beginning Monday, July 31, there will be a new DRC INSIGHT Enhanced Student Experience. The new test engine includes accessibility enhancements including:

- Improved WCAG 2.1 AA and 508 compliance


Tool improvements include:

 Magnification option.



Test Out Opportunities for Mathematics

Algebra I and Coordinate Algebra are being replaced with Algebra: Concepts and Connections for the 2023-2024 school year. Algebra: Concepts and Connections will require the EOC starting in Winter 2023 Main Administration. Students attempting to test out of the new Algebra: Concepts and Connections course during the August and September Mid-Month windows may be administered either the Algebra I or Coordinate Algebra EOC. Students attempting to test out during the 2024 March Mid-Month or 2024 Main administration will be administered the Algebra: Concepts and Connections EOC for this purpose.

Accountability Update

As a reminder, we have requested several changes to CCRPI, including eliminating the overall single score, aligning the literacy indicator with the Georgia Milestones on-grade-level reading measure, and expanding

opportunities for students to demonstrate readiness. We are still discussing our amendment with US ED and will provide an update as soon as possible.

The optional ASVAB Data Collection File for high schools is available in Live Data Verification for district users and high school principals. Additionally, district users can access the **ASVAB File Upload** application, which will close Tuesday, August 1, in the MyGaDOE Portal. If you have questions regarding the collection of ASVAB data, please reach out to your district's Accountability Point of Contact or your GaDOE accountability specialist.

Remember to finalize district plans now for completing the following summer CCRPI applications, which will close in late August. The **Assessment Matching** application will be updated this month with the remaining assessments to match. The **Non-Participation** application, **Cohort Withdrawal Update** application, and **Summer Graduate** collection will also be available in July. The **GAA 1%** application will be available for a short window in August. Look for emails with the exact closing dates and resources for the applications as they open. If you are not responsible for completing an

application, be sure to forward the email to the appropriate staff in your district.
