Policy Update

Georgia's Innovative Assessment Demonstration Authority

The U.S. Department of Education (ED) has approved Georgia's application for participation in the Innovative Assessment Demonstration Authority (IADA).

ED approved two consortia to develop and implement their assessment systems under the IADA. The Georgia MAP Assessment Partnership is partnering with NWEA to develop and implement MAP Growth for Georgia. The Putnam Consortium is partnering with Navvy Education, LLC to develop and implement Navvy. Both assessment systems include a series of formative or interim assessments administered throughout the school year that will roll up into a single, summative score.

The purpose of this demonstration authority is to provide a five-year period during which the approved assessment consortia can develop, implement, and scale their innovative assessment systems. During the same period, the GaDOE will manage the demonstration authority, collect stakeholder feedback, and oversee an external technical evaluation of the innovative assessment systems.

At the end of the demonstration authority (the close of the 2023-2024 school year), the state will determine whether either of the innovative assessment systems should be administered statewide. Georgia is required to determine which one assessment it will administer to all students by the end of its participation in the IADA.

This role must be carefully assigned, and thoughtful consideration must be made regarding FERPA and student privacy. The Assessment Director role should not be assigned to an individual in the district solely for the purpose of receiving email notifications. The STC (Assessment Director) is encouraged to share appropriate information with administrators and other personnel with careful consideration of FERPA and student information privacy.

Test Development

Georgia Milestones Test Design

As you may recall, new technology-enhanced (TE) item types were field tested during the Spring 2019 Georgia Milestones administration. These items performed well and were accepted by educators at the Item Review meeting in July. To allow for the use of these new item types, adjustments have been made to the test design for each assessment.

The table below summarizes, for each content area, the increase in the number of TE items, as well as the new total number of TE items, overall number of items on each test, and total points on each test. Note that the total number of items and total number of points remain unchanged.

Georgia Milestones Resources

Annual updates to several Georgia Milestones resources are currently in progress. The timeline below describes these updates and when they are expected to be available on the Georgia Milestones webpage:

- Mid-Late August 2019
 - Blueprints for all content areas will be updated to reflect changes to the number and types of items on each assessment.
 - Assessment Guides for all content areas will be initially updated with changes to the assessment design tables to reflect the increase in technology-enhanced items.
 - New narrative writing checklists will be available.
- Early November 2019
 - Experience Online Testing Georgia and the Secure Practice Test will be updated to include new technology-enhanced item types.
- Mid-Late November 2019

- Assessment Guides and Study Guides for math, science, and social studies will be updated to include additional technology-enhanced sample items.

In addition to the updates described above, additional resources aligned to narrative writing are also in development:

- Narrative Writing Checklist
 - Similar to the Writer's Checklist provided for the extended writing prompt, the Narrative Checklist will support students in responding to the narrative writing prompt.
 - A unique checklist will be developed for each grade/course, based on the narrative writing rubric.
 - Draft checklists were reviewed by educator committees during Item Review in July.
 - Narrative Checklist Schedule
 - Posted on GaDOE website: mid-August 2019
 - Added to Experience Online Testing Georgia and the Secure Practice Test: early November 2019
 - Incorporated into Assessment Guides: mid-November 2019
- Narrative Writing Item & Scoring Sampler
 - This sampler will be similar to the current Reading & Evidence-Based Writing section of the Item & Scoring Sampler, and will include:
 - One (1) narrative writing prompt per grade/course
 - Three (3) annotated student responses per score point
 - Anticipated release: November/December 2019
- Study Guide — Narrative Section
 - The Study Guide for each grade/course currently includes an Opinion/Argumentative unit and an Informational/Explanatory unit.
 - These units will be combined into one Writing unit, with the following sections:
 - W1. Opinion/Argumentative
 - W2. Informational/Explanatory
 - W3. Narrative
 - The narrative section will include:
 - A content-description page for narrative writing

- Narrative-specific key terms
 - One passage-based item set with a narrative prompt
 - An exemplar narrative response that corresponds to the new prompt
 - Additional “standalone” (not passage-based) multiple-choice items will also be added to each writing section.
- Anticipated release: January/February 2020

ACCESS For ELLs 2.0

Here’s a checklist of steps STCs should take to have a successful test administration this school year:

- Review the ACCESS for ELLs *Accessibility and Accommodations Manual* and be sure Test Participation Committees do the same.
- Be sure examiners understand the adaptive nature of the test.
- Be sure examiners know how to set online test sessions for each content area test in Grades 4–12.
- Participate in WIDA training identified on the Georgia Training and Testing Calendar.
- Only order Braille forms for those students who use Unified English Braille (UEB) during classroom instruction.
- Ensure your district has transitioned to Central Office Service (COS) Device from the Testing Site Manager (TSM). TSMs will not be supported after August 15.

Georgia Alternate Assessment 2.0

State Board of Education Approval

The Georgia Board of Education approved cut scores for GAA 2.0 in July 2019. With this approval, Questar has begun the quality control procedures needed to deliver reports to schools in September.

Accommodations and the GAA 2.0

It is important to remember that the GAA 2.0 is designed to measure achievement of students with the most significant cognitive disabilities. As such, supports have been built into the assessment to help students demonstrate their knowledge and skills, including scaffolding, simplified graphics, and descriptive language.

The assessment includes many built-in accessibility features to give examiners the maximum latitude needed to create an optimal testing environment for students including large print, simplified working, and large/simple graphics. Additionally, examiners are provided an opportunity to review tasks prior to the assessment in order to prepare for each individual administration. This allows examiners to select manipulatives to pair with tasks that support students’ engagement with test content and allow students to answer questions to the best of their ability. Teachers may also use this time to determine where they will schedule breaks, so students do not get overly tired during test administration. Additionally, examiners can use various reinforcement and refocusing strategies to help students complete assessment tasks.

Given the breadth of the supports made available to examiners, they must be careful not do anything that would hint at the correct response for the student. IEP teams must consider testing accommodations carefully as provided in the Allowable Accommodations for Students with Disabilities chart found in the *Student Assessment Handbook* and *Accessibility and Accommodations Manual*.

Georgia Milestones Assessment System

Updates

GRAPH PAPER

In the past, ¼” graph paper has only been allowed for EOC mathematics courses. Beginning with Spring 2020 EOG assessments, ¼” graph paper will be allowed as

scratch paper for all EOG mathematics assessments at any grade level.

CALCULATOR OPTIONS

Based on the results of a recent statewide survey, the GaDOE will be transitioning to the Desmos calculator for Georgia Milestones mathematics assessments, beginning with the Winter 2019 EOC administration. The Desmos calculator will be integrated into the DRC online testing engine.

The Desmos calculator is also available to students online and can be used on mobile devices, allowing for student practice with the calculator throughout the school year.

Districts will continue to have the option of allowing handheld calculators during the administration of the mathematics assessments.

READINESS FOR FALL MID-MONTH EOC ADMINISTRATIONS

The first Milestones testing for the new school year is the Fall Mid-Month EOC administration that opens on August 5. If your system will be participating, here are some reminders:

- STCs check to verify you have updated User permissions in eDIRECT.
- New STCs will need an eDIRECT account with the “System Test Coordinator” permission-set for their system. If the system’s superintendent has notified [Sandy Greene](#) at the GaDOE of a new STC, an eDIRECT account has been created.
- eDIRECT users that were active in the Summer Main administration have been rolled up as a user for the Fall Mid-Month 2019 administration.
- User accounts should be reviewed and accounts that are no longer needed should be inactivated.
- New users will need to be added and assigned permissions for the End of Course Fall Mid-Month 2019 administration as well as assigned permissions for any previous administrations for which access is needed.

- The Fall Mid-Month 2019 administration is an extension of 2018-2019 testing cycle so training for test security and test administration is still in force for returning personnel. Any new personnel serving as a coordinator or examiner at the school or system level should be trained on test security protocols, the test setup and management process, and test administration procedures.
- The STC should check with the System Technology Coordinator to verify servers used for testing are running Central Office Services (COS) version 3.0. It is recommended that INSIGHT be updated to version 10.0; however, the current version will still allow testing until August 30.
- On the [Georgia Milestones Presentations](#) webpage, the Fall 2019 EOC Mid-Month Test Setup and Winter Enrollment Counts Training is posted, and the PowerPoints from the Spring EOC main administration are still applicable to use for guidance and training. NAEP/NCES

The Long Term Trend (LTT) NAEP assessments will be held from October 2019 through May 2020. Mathematics and reading assessments will be given to 9-, 13-, and 17-year-olds. Each group has a separate testing window. These tests measure the growth of students in the nation over the same set of questions since the 1970s. Georgia has 55 schools from 21 districts that have been selected for LTT. Selected districts and schools have already been notified with their assigned assessment date.


GKIDS 2.0 and GKIDS Readiness Check

TestPad Update

TestPad is a tool in the SLDS that districts may use in multiple ways. TestPad contains test items related to content areas assessed by the Georgia Milestones Assessment System and NAEP. Teachers and administrators can utilize TestPad to create test items and develop formative and summative assessments, aligned to the state-adopted content standards, to assist in informing daily instruction. Since TestPad is a part of the Statewide Longitudinal Data System (SLDS); students, teachers and classes are automatically in the system. Teachers just create their benchmarks, assign to their students, then students log in and take the tests. See the link below for information regarding online training for TestPad.

Accountability Update

Accountability Point of Contact

As you know, GaDOE Assessment and Accountability leadership has asked that each district superintendent appoint an Accountability Point of Contact (POC).
