


Important Basic Facts

In order to be eligible for Accel funds, a 9-12 high school student must be taking coursework leading to an Associate or Baccalaureate Degree


Beginning with Fall term 2011, Accel courses have not been included in the HOPE Combined Paid-Hours limit



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Important Basic Facts

Accel courses are to be taken in three consecutive quarters or two consecutive semesters, beginning with the fall term and ending with the spring term



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Important Basic Facts

A student who meets the Georgia Residency must continue to do so for purposes of Accel eligibility

A student must be a United States citizen or an Eligible Non-Citizen for 12 consecutive months immediately prior to the first day of classes of the school term for which the Accel payment is sought



Important Basic Facts

- Accel students are eligible as part- or full-time and up to 15 hours will be funded
- Joint Enrollment students at a postsecondary institution are ineligible for Accel Program payments



Important Basic Facts

- Learning Support (remedial) coursework is ineligible for Accel
- 905.5. Responsibilities of the Eligible High School.
- 907.1. Application Process.
A student must complete an Accel Program Application and submit it to his or her Eligible High School for each school term



Important Basic Facts



- Accel funds are not available for summer terms
- Participation can be denied at any time by either the Eligible High School or the Eligible Postsecondary Institution for violations of their rules

Accel Changes/Least Known Facts

1. Accel eligibility has unlimited semesters or quarters

NEW

2. Students could take full load at high school and additional dual courses at the same time

NEW

3. If student taking combination of 7 or more courses per semester, system reports 6 segments of choice

NEW



Accel Changes/Least Known Facts

4. Beginning FY 14 high school graduates' with core dual enrollment courses on their transcripts will have .5 added to the grades for GPA HOPE Scholarship calculation **NEW**
5. Weight cannot raise grade above 4.0 **NEW**
6. This does not apply to the local grade, just HOPE Scholarship **NEW**



Accel Changes/Least Known Facts

7. Beginning this past Fall 2012, if a dual student's college grade is a "D" which could be in the 60's, and it is a passing grade at the postsecondary institution, the dual student could receive credit at high school based on local system decision **NEW**
8. HB 324-FAFSA will not be required for dual or HOPE **NEW**
9. A 9-12 grade student can participate but they must meet the Accel, secondary, and post-secondary requirements



Accel Changes/Least Known Facts

10. Local system can set requirements for dual students
11. Sign off sheet at the eligible high school is required before a student can participate
12. High school courses by 8th graders are not counted in HOPE GPA
13. No 8th graders can participate in dual enrollment programs



Accel Changes/Least Known Facts

14. Duplicate credit-dual core courses on approved lists and for elective credit only (Memo 8/7/2012 to Superintendents)
15. Summer credit from out of state institutions is local decision but EOCT for EOCT classes required

Summer credit from out of state institutions is local decision but EOCT for EOCT classes required



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MOWR Changes

The .5 grade addition for FY 14 graduates will apply to MOWR core courses the same as Accel

Dual credit unit conversions are set, not adjustable for local levels to change or interpret


- All courses must be taken at the college
