Georgia's Seal of Biliteracy

- Established in 2016 (3 yrs completed)
- Available to all K-12 public school students
- Available in 100+ languages
- English side: GPA in required ELA
- Proficiency Bar: Intermediate High
- Tiered System (Tier 1 & Tier 2)
- 2 recording cycles (May and Sept yearly)



Georgia's International Skills Diploma Seal


- Established in 2015 (4 yrs completed)
- Available in 106 High Schools
- 2 Areas: World Language / International Focus
- Unique in the USA
- STAR Students






Georgia's Biliteracy Seal Who is eligible?

- (1) Completion of all English language arts requirements for graduation with an overall grade point average of 3.0 or above in those classes; and
- (2) Proficiency in one or more languages other than English, demonstrated by passing a foreign language advanced placement examination with a score of 4 or higher or an international baccalaureate examination with a score of 5 or higher; provided, however, that for languages in which an advanced placement examination is not available, the Department of Education may provide a listing of equivalent summative examinations that local school systems may use in place of such an advanced placement examination.



Congratulations to all of Georgia's Seal of Biliteracy Recipients!



A total of 2,081 Seals of Biliteracy were awarded during the 2017-2018 school year! An increase of nearly 100% or a doubling of last year's numbers!

Spanish = 1,629 (33 Districts reporting)

German = 86 (7 Districts reporting)

French = 300 (9 Districts reporting)

Chinese = 23 (6 Districts reporting)

Latin = 26 (4 Districts reporting)

Bulgarian = 1 (1 District reporting)

Portuguese = 4 (3 Districts reporting)

Vietnamese = 4 (2 Districts reporting)

Cambodian = 1 (1 District reporting)




Updated Guidance for the Georgia Seal of Biliteracy Spring 2020

- The first reporting deadline has been extended to <u>May 8th</u> and is for all seniors, who are earning the seal via a Tier 2 test as seniors or underclassmen or a qualifying AP or IB exam score as underclassmen.
- All other senior AP or IB test takers, who qualify for the seal by virtue of their test results this coming summer, will have until <u>Sept</u>
 <u>1st</u> to submit their seal request for the retroactive awarding of the seal.
- The <u>May 8th</u> deadline may be extended for systems and schools who are experiencing extenuating circumstances due to the current disruption on a case by case basis.




Seal of Biliteracy Growth in Georgia

Growth in # of Seals of Biliteracy 2017-2019




Growth in # of Districts Reporting 2017-2019





The International Skills Diploma Seal is awarded to graduating high school students who complete an international education curriculum and engage in extracurricular activities and experiences that foster the achievement of global competencies.





Georgia's International Skills Diploma Seal What is required?

Qualifications for the International Skills Diploma Seal

To be awarded the **International Skills Diploma Seal**, students need to complete:

- Coursework in the following areas (8 credits total)
 - World Languages

 (at least three credits in the same world language and/or ESOL)
- International Focus

 (at least four credits in courses
 determined to have an international
 focus, such as international economics,
 world/non—U.S. history, world
 geography, etc.)
- At least four extracurricular activities and experiences with global themes and/or in global contexts (e.g. exchange programs, international and language clubs, travel abroad)
- Twenty hours of community service involving a global/cross-cultural public service project
- Capstone presentation on the knowledge gained in the courses and activities listed above

- At least 3 World Language Credits
- At least 4 International Focus courses
- At least 4 extracurricular activities with a global/international context.
- 20 hours of community service
- Capstone Presentation (Incorporating all the above aspects)



Georgia's International Skills Diploma Seal School Application Process

School Application Process

Schools that are applying to offer the International Skills Diploma Seal for the first time must complete the application here and submit it to pwallace@doe.k12.ga.us by December 15th. Schools that have already been approved do not need to apply for succeeding years. (One-time approval process per school)

School applications will be evaluated via this <u>rubric</u> and schools will be notified of the status of their application by February 1st.


- School Application's must be submitted by Aug 30th or Dec 15th
- ISDS Review Committee meets to evaluate Applications
- School informed of application's status by Sept 20th or Feb 1st.
- Application posted online with evaluation rubric.



Georgia's International Skills Diploma Seal Student Reporting Process

Student Awarding Process

Once a school has been approved to offer the International Diploma Seal to their students, they have until April 15th to request the number of Seals to be awarded to qualifying candidates via this <u>link</u>.



- Student Seal Requests submitted by April 15th every year.
- STAR ISDS Student Reporting is on a separate form and is due by April 15th.
- ISDS Awards Ceremony is during 3rd week of April.
- Seals are sent out after April 15th to Individual Schools/Districts

Updated Guidance for the Georgia International Skills Diploma Seal Program Spring 2020

- The reporting deadline has been extended to <u>May 8th</u> for both the reporting of the Seal requests and each participating ISDS school's STAR student.
- The 20-hour community service requirement has been waived for this year's senior class.
- In lieu of our traditional Awards Celebration for this year's STAR ISDS Students, students and their parents may opt to be recognized publicly by participating in our 2020 online ISDS STAR Student Celebration Program.
- The <u>May 8th</u> deadline may be extended for systems and schools who are experiencing extenuating circumstances due to the current disruption on a case by case basis.
