State Board of Education Updates

On May 5, 2016, the State Board of Education approved updates to the list of State-funded subjects and courses in compliance with State Board of Education Rule [160-4-2-.20 LIST OF STATE-FUNDED K-8 SUBJECTS AND 9-12 COURSES FOR STUDENTS ENTERING NINTH GRADE IN 2008 AND SUBSEQUENT YEARS](#). The list was updated to phase-out outdated CTAE courses, to clarify a section of coding for CTAE labs, to clarify that the gifted section numbers (70.) are for gifted program students only, and to remove the generic dual enrollment numbers that were listed at the end of each content area prior to the new GaTRACS course numbering system now being used for MOWR course matches.

The State Board of Education (SBOE) postponed the adoption of the Social Studies Georgia Standards of Excellence (GSE) at the March 31, 2016, State Board meeting. Social Studies committee members reconvened and made recommendations to the Social Studies GSE on April 20, 2016. On May 5, 2016, the SBOE approved the [re-posting of draft Social Studies GSE and for 30 days of public review and comment](#). If approved, the projected date for implementation is school year 2017-2018.

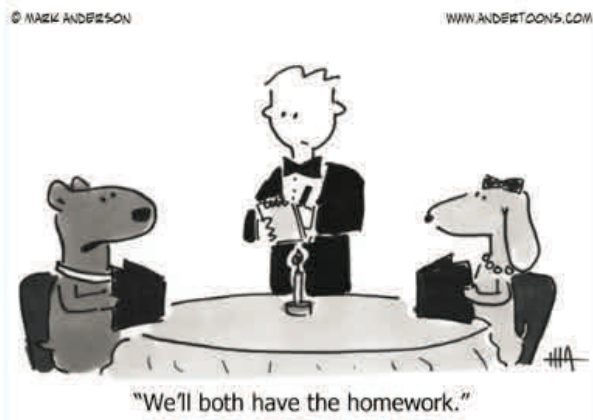
Professional Learning Opportunity

Building a Culture of Writing

This fall, the GaDOE ELA team will launch a six-month literacy series entitled *Collaborative Conversations for Building a Culture of Writing*. This series will be an interactive online series designed to build teachers' pedagogical knowledge while cultivating a culture of writing. Teachers in grade K – 5 and 6 – 12 will work through six sessions in which researchers and classroom teachers, together, will share evidence-based writing practices and show what those practices look like in a real classroom. By connecting practice to theory, this series will answer questions about writing instruction, engage teachers in professional growth, impact instructional practices, and ultimately, cultivate a culture of writing.

The series begins September 2016 and offers 3 tiers of participation for teachers/school/districts to customize professional learning to meet their unique needs.

Mathematics Updates

Georgia's K-12 Mathematics and CTAE Teachers are awesome as indicated by the results of a recent survey conducted by our state CTAE staff and directed to Youth Apprenticeship Program employers. Survey results reveal a significant increase from last year's results in the percentage of students enrolled in the statewide program who use math at the level employers expect – from 82.4% last year to 89%. Thank you to our Georgia K-12 Mathematics and CTAE Teachers for making a difference in "Educating Georgia's Future".

The College Readiness Mathematics Professional Learning Summer Institute slated for June 8-10 has reached capacity as evidenced by current registration numbers. Reminder: Student MOWR Participation Forms must be completed for each term including the summer of 2016 before a student can participate in the program.

Look for the new MOWR Guidelines on GaCollege411.org this month through Georgia Student Finance Commission.

School systems do not earn FTE for MOWR summer school. MOWR grades must be put on the student's transcript. MOWR withdrawals should be treated as an "F" for the high school grade if the student does not come back to the high school at the time of the withdrawal and complete the high school course. Study Trip to Germany: Call for Participation

Administrators, thought leaders, can experience a 10-day, one-of-a-kind educational excursion to Germany!

- Gain insights into German educational systems through visits to schools and educational institutions
- Meet other educators, administrators and policy makers
- Learn about vocational education and studying in Germany

What is the aim?

With this trip we want to foster administrative support for German language education in the United States and promote networking between American and German educational partners, and thereby increase American students' opportunities to learn German language and culture.

Who should apply?

Administrative and thought leaders of primary or secondary school districts and educational authorities. Your school(s) may have or you may be interested in adding a German language program in your school or district.

When will the trip take place and where will it go?

The trip will take place between September 11th and September 21st 2016. Participants will travel to Berlin, the capital of Germany, and to the Federal State of Thuringia.

How much does it cost?

The Central Agency for Schools Abroad (ZfA) covers:

- The flight from New York to Berlin
- Lodging in Germany
- Transportation inside Germany
- Food in Germany

Participants are responsible for their transport to New York. A contribution towards expenses for food and social program will be charged. Depending on actual prices, this contribution will be between \$300 to \$500 per person.

Request for Proposals (RFP) for Mathematics and Science Partnership (MSP) Program Grants (Title II B)

The Georgia MSP Program seeks to improve the content knowledge and ability to analyze student thinking of cohort groups of mathematics and/or science teachers of grades K-5, 6-8, and/or 9-12 in order to increase the achievement of their students. These improvement efforts are designed, implemented, and evaluated by strong partnerships between college and university faculty, high-need school systems, RESAs, and other qualifying partners.

Any Georgia high-need school system or consortium may submit a proposal for funding in partnership with an institution of higher education. In order to qualify as high-need, a school system must demonstrate that at least 40% of its students qualify for the free and reduced meal plan according to the most recent data collected by the GaDOE. Projects must include teachers from Priority (Comprehensive), Focus (Targeted), or other Title I schools..

Georgia MSP Program funding may be used to support the following endeavors:

- To provide mathematics and/or science teachers, including special education teachers, in grades K-12 with intensive and follow-up content training aligned to the State Standards in mathematics and/or science;
- To advance the disciplinary content depth, pedagogical content acumen, and cognitive disciplinary instructional skills of grades K-12 teachers of mathematics and/or science;
- To provide advanced college-level coursework to K-12 teachers of mathematics and/or science; and
- To include building-level administrators meaningfully in content training sessions.

October 2016 PSAT for Sophomores

The recently signed FY17 state budget contains funding to provide the PSAT/NMSQT exam in the fall of 2016 for all sophomores enrolled in Georgia public high schools. The PSAT coordinator at your high school(s) should receive an email notice in May of the timeline for placing the school's initial 2016 order in the online application. The deadline is generally mid-June. Two dates are available for schools to select as a testing 2016 date: October 19 or November 2. These two date options should accommodate systems in Georgia that have a weeklong fall break.
