This is also accessible via our website. When your school or system is ready to report your seal requests prior to the 2nd reporting deadline of Sept 1st, simply submit via this form and we will confirm the request via email.

A reminder, I have also recently updated the reporting procedures for the International Skills Diploma Seal as well. Again, the intent is to simplify the reporting and application procedures, systems and schools can now report qualifying students via an online form here. Additionally, I have added an additional form for ISDS schools or systems wishing to request that courses be considered for pre-approval on the home page here. A reminder, the application process is now open and will be open through December 15th of 2017. The application along with the rubric the committee used to evaluate these applications are available via the website. I want to encourage schools and world language programs to offer this important Seal and of course I am ready to assist in this process as requested.
