



• On Thursday, June 14th Georgia celebrated the ribbon cutting of the first Japanese-

English Dual Language Immersion School which will be located in the city of Peachtree Corners in Gwinnett. The event was well attended by several dignitaries, including State School Superintendent, Mr. Richard Woods, Mr. Takashi Shinozuka, Japanese Consul General of Atlanta, Mr. Mike Mason, Mayor of Peachtree Corners, Mrs. Charlotte Nash, Chairman of the Gwinnett Board of Commissioners and Representatives Scott Hilton, Pedro Marin and Tom Taylor. After the official



ribbon cutting, dignitaries participated in the planting of a Kwanzan Cherry Tree and Dogwood Tree as a sign of partnership and friendship between Georgia and Japan. Students joining ICAGeorgia's program from Kindergarten are immersed in Japanese for 80% of the day, with the remaining 20% being in English. 


