

- ✓ **What** is a Rule?

A State Board Rule may be necessary to:

- ✓ **Operationalize** new or amended state or federal legislation (often a legislative bill will require the State Board to promulgate a rule)
- ✓ **Clarify** existing code or law
- ✓ **Assure** more economical and efficient operation of public education
- ✓ **Change** a program mode of operation for overall improvement
- ✓ **Address** research outcomes recommended by the State School Superintendent

Courses and/or Standards

- ✓ GaDOE Curriculum & Instruction
- ✓ After vetting and working with committees, GaDOE makes recommendation to the State Board of Education to post for 30 days.
- ✓ After 30-day public review, GaDOE makes recommendation to the SBOE to approve courses/standards.


Georgia Milestones EOC Results 2017-18






AP Pass Rate %

Standards vs. Curriculum

- **Educational standards are the learning goals for what students should know and be able to do at each grade level**
 - Student expectations
 - Define success
 - Remain constant
- **A curriculum is the detailed plan used to teach students**
 - Curriculum includes activities, lessons, units, assessments, and instructional decisions
 - Can be altered year-to-year or classroom-to-classroom

What Makes a Good Set of Standards?

- Provides structure for teachers/districts to develop curriculum that address the goals of K-12 education
- Promotes content literacy
- Is based on a thorough analysis of education research in a content area
- Broad-based that allows for curriculum diversity
- Teacher infused: Georgia grown-Georgia owned




