### L4GA PROPOSALS DUE FEBRUARY 10

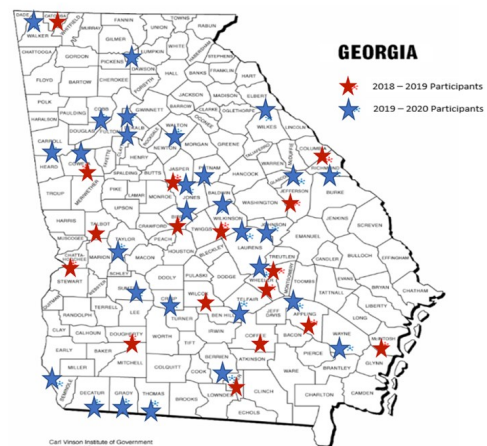
The Georgia Department of Education has been awarded nearly \$179+M to support literacy efforts in the state's K-12 public schools through the federal Comprehensive Literacy State Development Grant. 95% of these funds will be distributed through competitive grants to local education agencies. ## State Board of Education Updates

### RURAL GIFTED ENDORSEMENT IN GEORGIA



The State Board of Education authorized an increase in the total amount of a contract using Title IVA funds. The funds will be used to add two additional classes in areas of rural Georgia that will result in 60 teachers to complete their Gifted Endorsement.

- Provide proven professional development and training to enhance teacher skills and strategies

### GROWING NUMBERS OF GEORGIA TEACHERS ACHIEVE COMPUTER SCIENCE CREDENTIALS

Thanks to our new Computer Science CS standards and legislation, we are seeing record numbers of teachers achieving a computer science credential. The Georgia Professional Standards Commission has established standards for a pre-service teaching credential through a course of undergraduate study, an in-service teaching add-on credential with a GACE exam, and an in-service teaching endorsement through approved programs of study. The last is currently offered at six institutions: three universities and 3 RESAs

The 2020 Mathematics Standards Review process is well underway! More than 200 mathematics teachers and teacher leaders on the Teacher Working Committees have concluded their first session of analyzing and refining mathematics grade-level and course standards. They are now gearing up to continue the work of reviewing and revising the Georgia Standards of Excellence during the second session in late February.

They have listened to many voices, including the Stakeholder Survey respondents and the Citizens Review Committee conducted at the request of Governor Kemp and Superintendent Woods, to ensure that parents' and community members' voices are part of the thought-leadership in designing new and improved standards to continuously improve student outcomes in Georgia.

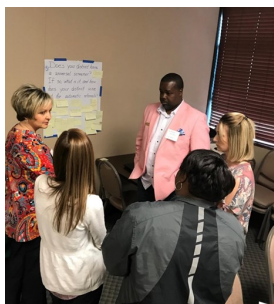
