Recognizing that Georgia's educators and students are currently in the midst of an unprecedented disruption, no state tests — to include Georgia Milestones EOGs and EOCs, GKIDS, GAA 2.0 and CTAE EOPAs — will be administered for the 2019-2020 school year. Georgia applied for and received a one-year waiver from the federal government of assessment and accountability requirements.

Georgia Public Broadcasting and the Georgia Department of Education have partnered to provide digital education content for students, educators, and families during the COVID-19 crisis.

## State Board of Education Updates

### GEORGIA STUDENT WAIVERS

On March 26, 2020 the Georgia State Board of Education adopted a [Resolution](#) for waivers from specific state laws, rules and regulations for all Georgia school districts, State Schools, Department of Juvenile Justice and the Department of Corrections for the remainder of the 2019-2020 School Year Due to Impacts of COVID-19.
