Feeder Pattern Grant Requirement

A goal of *Literacy for Learning, Living, and Leading in Georgia* is to create systemic improvements; therefore, sub-grant awardees will review strategically review data and prioritize implementation of changes by looking at how children may matriculate through the systems within a community.

Each LEA-Partnership must include a feeder system that includes at least one early education center (e.g., Head Start, Early Head Start, and/or Quality Rated (QR) child care (or a QR applicant), and/or Georgia PreK), a community partner organization, and schools serving students from Kindergarten through grade 12.
