



- Utilize social media
- Offer support nights
- Create community partners
- Conducting home visits/individual phone calls to families
- Conduct family surveys



### **Communication Strategies with Parents**

- Develop community roundtable with local stakeholders (library, health department, school representative from board of education, early head start/head start, childcare providers)
- Community Kiddie Carnival/Kinder Round-Up
- Invite daycare stake holders to visit local public schools.
- Offer family workshops at central locations






