PBIS Assessment

Participation in PBIS Assessment by the school and the PBIS District Coordinator is mandatory. <u>All SAS and TFI scores must be in PBIS Assessment (www.pbisapps.org</u>) by May 15, 2020 to be considered.



Tiered Fidelity Inventory (TFI) Walkthrough and TFI Assessment Guidance

Neutral observer trained in PBIS should conduct walkthrough and attend TFI meeting

One walkthrough is required, more recommended

All TFI scores should be entered at the <u>SAME</u> time for each tier



Key Data Elements

Baseline: Year prior to the year a team was trained

- State Reportable Office Discipline Referrals Per 100 Students: (total ODRs/total students x 100)
- In-School Suspension Days Per 100 Students: (total ISS days/total students x 100)
- Out-of-School Suspension Days Per 100 Students: (total OSS days/total students x 100)

 Stable or Declining: Comparing 4 years ago to current year or baseline year if PBIS was implemented less than 2 years ago
 Percentage change of ≤ 15%

School is in the lowest quartile for their grade band



Installing Outcome Data/Artifacts

Installing – Training Year

- Submit EOY data
- Submit action plan aligned with TFI

- Installing Post Training Year
 - ≻TFI Tier I 0-69%
 - TFI Tier I students 0-1 ODRs 0-74%
 - Submit action plan aligned with TFI



≻A TFI Tier I scale score \ge 70%

➤Tier I state reportable Office Discipline Referrals (ODRs) all students: 0-1 ≥ 75%

State reportable ODRs, ISS OR OSS days (2 of the 3) are stable or declining

Submit 2019-20 action plan via SLDS or online form



Operational Outcome Data/Artifacts

≻A TFI Tier I scale score \ge 85%

>A TFI Tier II scale score > zero

➤Tier I state reportable Office Discipline Referrals (ODRs) all students: 0-1 ≥ 85%

State reportable ODRs, ISS and OSS days are all stable or declining

Submit 2019-20 action plan via SLDS or online form



Distinguished Outcome Data/Artifacts

≻A TFI Tier I scale score \ge 90%

≻A TFI Tier II scale score \ge 70%


➤Tier I state reportable Office Discipline Referrals (ODRs) all students: 0-1 ≥ 90%

State reportable ODRs, ISS and OSS days are all stable or declining

Submit 2019-20 action plan via SLDS or online form.

Zero incidents of corporal punishment





Tier I TFI: A minimum of one TFI Walkthrough is required for the 2015. Walkthrough is conducted prior to each TFI meeting to better inform the PBIS team.

**Guidance for the SAS:

A minimum of one Self-Assessment Survey (SAS) administration is required for the 2019-2020 school year. Administering it early in the year is *recommended* to help inform action planning. It is also *recommended* that at least 80% of staff complete the SAS for reliable results.

Tier II scale score > zero	Operational
Zero incidents of corporal punishment	Distinguished
