What Does IDEA Say?

According to IDEA Sec. 300.39(b), "(3) Specially designed instruction means adapting, as appropriate to the **needs** of an eligible child under this part, the **content, methodology, or delivery of instruction**— (i) To address the **unique needs** of the child that result from the child's disability; and (ii) To **ensure access** of the child to the general curriculum, so that the child **can meet** the educational standards within the jurisdiction of the public agency that apply to all children."

FY'23 Timeline

- February \rightarrow Submit pilot application and proposal for consideration
- $March \rightarrow Application \ review$
- April → Announcement of pilot districts
- July \rightarrow District data review & analysis with LEA administrator(s)

Pilot Assurances

- \rightarrow Administrator training sessions with follow up coaching
- \rightarrow Teacher training sessions with follow up coaching
- \rightarrow IEP review & coaching for PLAAFP writing
- \rightarrow Guided instruction
- ightarrow District data collection & analysis with strategic planning for systemic improvement
- \rightarrow Implementation Fidelity Measures
- \rightarrow Sustainability planning
