




#### **Ensuring Students Succeed**

"The greatest source to make the difference is the teacher and it is what teachers know, do and care about that is very powerful to the equation of student achievement". (Hattie, 2003)







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### **Teachers Leaving the Field of Education**

"More than half (55%) of members say they are more likely to leave or retire from education sooner than planned because of the pandemic, almost double the number saying the same in July 2020." (Walker, 2022)

More alarming is the 62% of Black and 59% of Hispanic/Latino teachers are looking at exiting. The statistics are alarming especially since these are already underrepresented in the teaching profession. (Walker, 2022)

Teachers at Title I schools turnover at rates:<sup>2</sup> 50% higher than other schools

70% higher in math and science



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#### Why do Teachers Leave the Profession





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


#### **Retained within State**

### Leading Us Out of the Teacher Retention Crisis


Given that 20 to 30 percent of all new teachers nationwide leave the field entirely within the first five years of their career, alternative certification programs and schools need to prepare with two-year staff onboarding and induction programs. (Kini et al., 2016)

#### **Professionally Qualified is ESSA**

- The language is now "professionally qualified".
- We now have teachers who meet professional qualifications.
- Professional qualifications are for all teachers in every Local Education Agency (LEA), school and program.
- Right to Know Notification language is teaching in the field of discipline of the certification of the teacher.

Please remove all "highly qualified" language from handbooks and other documents and update with "professionally qualified" language and requirements. Title I is responsible for PQ.



### Minimum PQ Established by the LEA

O.C.G.A. § 20-2-984 Georgia law authorizes GaPSC to establish certification requirements. What is In-Field According to ESSA? ESSA Section 111(h)(1)(c)(ix)

To be "ESSA In-Field" a teacher must have certification or licensure in the subject and grade level band assigned OR meet GaPSC requirement CWD – Charter Waiver Codes: 1) degree in the subject area assigned, OR 2) coursework in subject area assigned – 21 semester/35 quarter hours, OR 3) a passing score on a content area test in the subject assigned.



### **In-Field Requirements**



- Requirement of ESSA
- LEA Reports to GaDOE
- GaDOE Reports to USED
- Teacher must hold GaPSC certification in the subject and grade level band or have the equivalent credentials

#### **Teachers Reported**

All PK-12 teachers reported in Student Class including: GNETS, Contractors, Gifted, ESOL, Special Education & EIP

#### **Standards Set for Reporting**

All educators must hold a clearance certificate GaPSC Issued Induction/Professional Certification in Subject & Grade Level Assigned OR Certification Equivalent Reported in Student Class through Charter Waiver Codes 101, 102, 103, 105.



## **Required State Reporting – In-Field**

#### State/LEA Report Card

The LEA Report Card shall include the professional qualifications of all Georgia educators (SEA, LEA and School level data), including information (that shall be presented in the aggregate and disaggregated by high poverty compared to low poverty schools) on the number and percentage of:

- Inexperienced teachers, principals, and other school leaders,
- Teachers teaching with emergency or provisional credentials, and
- Teachers who are not teaching in the subject or field for which the teacher is certified or licensed.

#### Annual State Report to USDE

The Annual State Report submitted to the Secretary of the United States Department of Education shall include information on the professional qualifications of teachers in the State, including information on <u>the</u> <u>number and the percentage</u> of the following teachers:

- Inexperienced teachers,
- Teachers who are not teaching in the subject or field for which the teacher is certified or licensed,
- Teachers who are teaching emergencies or provisional credentials, and
- Retention rates of effective and ineffective teachers, principals, or other school leaders.





# Certification Requirements Not Waivable



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#### **Clearance Certificate**

A clearance certificate is issued by the (GaPSC) after a criminal background check and passing the Ethics Exam. It is required for all educators employed in the LEA.



### **Paraprofessionals**

The State of Georgia ensures that it has professional standards for all paraprofessionals working in any school, including qualifications that were in place on the day before the date of enactment of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA).

In Georgia, a paraprofessional employed by a Georgia Local Unit of Administration (LUA), must meet one of the following requirements:

- **Degree**: Hold an associate's degree or higher in any subject from a Georgia Professional Standards Commission (GaPSC) accepted accredited institution; or
- **Coursework**: Have completed two (2) years of college coursework (sixty [60] semester hours) at a GaPSC accepted accredited institution; or
- **Content Area Test**: Have passed the GACE Paraprofessional Assessment. If eligibility is established through the assessment, the applicant must also hold a minimum of a high school diploma or GED equivalent.

#### Paraprofessionals must a certificate issued from GaPSC!



### **Special Education Service Requirements**

Charter and SWSS LEAs cannot waive Special Education certification for service (Adapted or General). These teachers are providing service and are not issuing grades for content.





## **Special Education Service Certification**

#### **505-2-.110 SPECIAL EDUCATION GENERAL CURRICULUM**

Educators certified in <u>Special Education General Curriculum</u> are infield to provide educational services for students in grades P-12 with disabilities whose Individualized Education Program (IEP) indicates instruction using the general education curriculum and participation in the general statewide assessment in grades P-12.

#### **505-2-.107 SPECIAL EDUCATION ADAPTED CURRICULUM**

Educators certified in <u>Special Education Adapted Curriculum</u> are infield to provide educational services for all students in grades P-12 with disabilities whose Individualized Education Program (IEP) indicates instruction in <u>alternate content standards</u> leading to participation in the Georgia Alternate Assessment (GAA).



#### **Special Education Elementary Service Certification**

#### 505-2-.56 SPECIAL EDUCATION GENERAL CURRICULUM/EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

Educators certified in <u>Special Education General Curriculum/Early</u> <u>Childhood Education</u> are in-field to provide educational services for all students in grades P-5, special education preschool (ages 3-5) and cognitive level P-5, including those with disabilities whose Individualized Education Program (IEP) indicates instruction using the general education curriculum and participation in the general statewide assessment.





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
## **Special Education Service Requirements**

The requirements for Special Education teachers that align with the student's IEP for service:

- A teacher providing instruction to a student being instructed using the general curriculum without a designated GAA flag in student record, must hold the Special Education General Curriculum (P-12).
- A teacher providing instruction to a student being instructed using alternate content standards **with** a designated GAA flag in student record, must have the Special Education Adapted Curriculum (P-12).
- A teacher providing instruction to special education students participating in the general curriculum and other students participating in the adapted curriculum at the same time, must have both certifications.
- A teacher with BD, LD, VI, Deaf Education, or Physical or Health Disability certification is in-field only when all students are receiving support in the disability area of certification.

## **Right to Know Notification**

Right to Know is the notification disseminated to parents informing them that they have the right to know the professional qualifications of the teachers and paraprofessionals who serve their child(ren).

The notifications should be disseminated within the first 30 days of school or enrollment.

Notifications are required to use the language of the law.

Right to Know Notifications are disseminated to all parents.




### **Right to Know Notification**

### **Requirements for Content**

- In Georgia, notifications must occur within 30 calendar days from the start of school or upon enrollment.
  - For verification purposes, notifications must contain the month/year of dissemination or, if included in another document, the primary document must contain a date. Or, if the primary document is undated, records may also include supplemental documentation that contains the month/year of notification dissemination.
  - For verification purposes, the name of the LEA and/ or school must be included.
- LEAs notifications MUST use the language of the law.
- In Georgia, LEAs are required to notify parents in all LEA schools or programs.
- Responses to requests must be provided in a timely manner.
- Maintain records of annual notifications that meet the above requirements.

# **20 Day Notification**



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### **20 Day Notification**

A 20 Day Notification is required when a student has been **assigned or taught for four or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who does not meet applicable GaPSC 'in-field' State certification or professional qualification requirements** (in alignment with the approved Charter/SWSS application and CLIP) requirements at the grade level(s) and/or subject area(s) in which the teacher has been assigned.

LEAs are required to disseminate 20 Day Notification for Special Education service teachers who **do not** have certification in alignment with the student's IEP and EIP teachers if they have been assigned or taught for four or more consecutive weeks.

20 Day Notifications are not disseminated to all parents. They are only disseminated to the parents of students who meet the 20 Day Notification criteria.

Notifications must go home within 10 business days following the 20 Days.

20 Day Notification Are Not Required for clearance certificates, paraprofessionals, and substitutes.







  - Day/Month/Year of notification
  - Name of the teacher who has not met professional qualification requirements
  - Name of the LEA and/ or school/program
  - Statement that the teacher has not met State certification OR LEA charter/ strategic waiver professional qualification requirements for the grade level(s) and/or subject area(s) in which the teacher is assigned. <u>Grade level and/or subject</u> area must be identified.
- In Georgia, notification requirements apply to ALL teachers in all LEA schools/programs.
- Maintain records of notifications that meet the above requirements.

#### 20 Day Notification of Professional Qualifications

- In Georgia, notification requirements apply to all teachers in all LEAs and schools/ programs within each LEA.
- LEAs must notify parents if a teacher has not met subject or grade level requirements for professional qualifications in compliance with state law for more than four consecutive weeks. In Georgia, this means either GaPSC certification requirements, or, if certification is waived under the Official Code of Georgia 20-2-80, 20-2- 2065 or State Board Rules 160-5-1-.33, 160-4-9-.07, the minimum qualifications established by each LEA.
- In Georgia, this notification must be made within 10 business days following the four consecutive weeks. See the ESSA PQ & In-Field Implementation Guide for best practices or contact GaDOE Staff.

LEAs are not required to send 20 Day Notifications for paraprofessionals and substitutes. service and EIP teachers who <u>DO</u> <u>NOT Meet</u> State Certification Requirements 20 Day Notifications must be sent. LEA Professional Qualification Requirements 20 Day Notification of PQ must be sent.
