## Quick Facts about the Special Needs Scholarship Program

- 1. Private Schools participating in the Special Needs Scholarship Program are not required to provide special education services to students.
- 2. Scholarship funds in most cases do not cover all costs at a private school and are only intended to offset tuition and fees at a private school.
- 3. Scholarship funds cannot be used to offset the costs of out of district tuition, charter schools, transportation, or other options available under public school choice.
- 4. Promotion or retention of a student does not affect eligibility for the Special Needs Scholarship Program.
- 5. A student may continue to participate in the GSNS Program if:
  - Student has continual enrollment and attendance in a private school participating in the GSNS Program
  - Student remains a resident of Georgia
  - Student's parent/guardian remain residents of Georgia
  - Parent/guardian complies with GSNS Program law and rule
- 6. An IEP does not need to be kept current to continue a student's participation in the Special Needs Scholarship Program.
- 7. Eligibility for the GSNS Program ends if:
  - A student leaves an authorized private school and doesn't re-enroll in another authorized private school

OR

A student graduates from high school

OR

- A student turns 22 years old by September 1<sup>st</sup> and has not yet graduated from high school
- 8. Scholarship funds cannot be used to pay for the following:
  - Transportation
  - Athletic fees
  - Before or after school care
  - School supplies
  - Meals
  - Summer school programs
  - Tutoring
  - Other fees as determined by the GADOE
  - Fees associated with field trips
