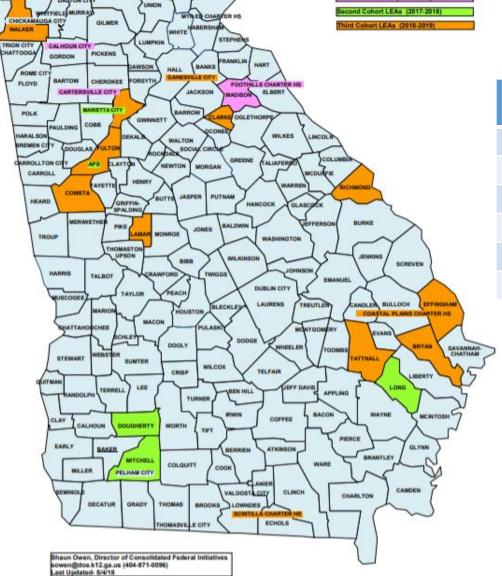

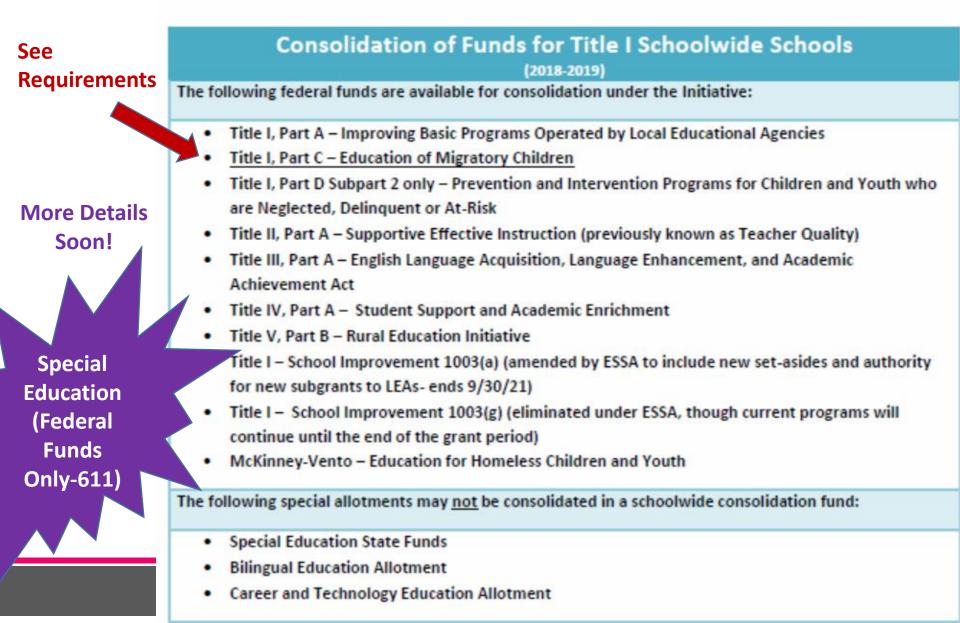

Consolidation of Funds

The Georgia Department of Education and school districts across Georgia are conducting the Consolidation of Funds Initiative to fully consolidate federal, state, and local funds in specific Title I schools that operate schoolwide programs. Once these funds are consolidated, the federal funds lose their identity as federal funds, and expenditures of those funds are no longer limited to the federal requirements for individual programs. A schoolwide program school that consolidates federal program funds "is not required to meet most statutory or regulatory requirements of the program applicable at the school level, but must meet the intent and purposes of that program to ensure that the needs of the intended beneficiaries are met."

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UGG & Purchasing Requirements

Since consolidated funds are viewed as state and local monies, we do not believe districts have to get quotes when hitting the \$3,500 threshold and below \$25,000. Is this accurate?



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When a district chooses to consolidate its funds into what Georgia is calling Fund 150 (combined state, local, & federal funds) any purchases made with those funds at the school level are designated as state/local purchases and are not subject to most Uniform Grant Guidance (UGG) requirements. This, for example, means no quotes are required to be kept on file for purchases over the \$3500 threshold (per UGG small purchase requirements). It also means that suspension and debarment checks through the System for Award Procurement (SAM) website as required for expenditures totaling over the \$25,000 threshold are not required, as well.

Since consolidated funds are viewed as state and local monies, we do not believe districts have to get quotes when hitting the \$3,500 threshold and below \$25,000. Is this accurate?



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However, the LEA must follow the procurement procedures established by the LEA and adhere to any state requirements. Some local districts have actually adopted UGG as the standard to protect the accounting records and procedures for the district, so please check your district and state guidelines for proper procurement procedures currently in place in your district. Auditors monitor LEA expenditures based on the procedures in place by the District at the time of purchase.

However, any federal funds not consolidated must follow UGG requirements. Please also remember that, for example, only school funds can be consolidated, thus Title I set-asides (central office funds) and any district level activities funded with any programmatic federal funds must revert back to follow UGG procurement guidelines, since these are fully considered federal funds outside of consolidation.

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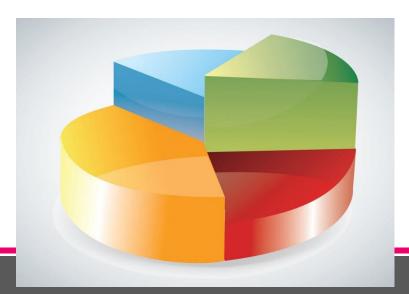
- Once you have allocated funds to the school level and placed into Fund 150, you cannot move the funds around throughout the year.
- You can also add more funds to Fund 150 throughout the year, such as carryover funds.
- However, you can move the funds out at the end-ofthe-year and normal carryover rules apply.

Fund 150- Helpful Tip



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- Therefore, when it doubt, err on the side of caution as you can always push additional funds into the pot throughout the year.
- Any time additional funds are added, be sure to change the overall percentage at the school level.
