





Equitable Services Updates Part 2 Invitations for 2021-2022 ESSA Equitable Services – Send Fall 2020

LEA FEDERAL PROGRAMS DIRECTOR

- Title I, Part A:
 - Invite all schools in the LEA.
 - Invite all schools outside the LEA who report serving students who reside in a Title I attendance zone using the annual DE1111.
- Title VIII (IC, IIA, IIIA, IVA, IVB):
 - Invite all schools in the LEA.
 - IVB Invite schools in the attendance zone outlined in the approved application.

PRIVATE SCHOOL OFFICIALS

- Not Interested:
 - Decline and return ES4PS Invitation.
- Unsure:
 - Accept and return ES4PS Invitation.
 - Make a determination in consultation.
- Interested:

Equitable Services Updates Part 2 2019-2020 GUIDANCE UPDATES

LEAs and Private Schools

- 08.2019 If a private school does not attend non-refundable PD and has not communicated with LEA, funds may be considered declined.
- 02.2020 –Origin of cost is not a factor in authorizing reimbursement for PD - If a private school would like to pay registration on behalf of a teacher (both teacher and registration agreed upon in consultation), the LEA may reimburse the teacher who may reimburse the school.
- 02.2020 LEAs should discuss selecting PD opportunities where travel and registration are refundable or transferable.

LEAs

 02.2020 - LEAs cannot report private school teachers as employees; they must treat them as contracted vendors. Only employees of the district are reported in the 1XX salaries and 580 travel object codes. Private school teachers should be paid out of 300. Both the salary and travel would be paid to the teacher (set up as a vendor) and reported on the 1099. The private school teacher would then be allowed to deduct travel expenditures when preparing their taxes, in accordance with IRS rules and regulations. Contractors, per IRS guidelines, must report all income earned in that capacity on their taxes via a 1099, and then they can deduct the travel expenses via Schedule C of their tax return.





Equitable Services Updates Part 2 GUIDANCE FROM GADOE

LEA FEDERAL PROGRAMS DIRECTOR

- Reminder: If LEA is transferring 100% of Funds from Title II, Part A or Title IV, Part A (after consultation with Private School) the LEA should not check the program as available on Form A for equitable services. Form A should align with program budget that indicates 100% transferred.
- Reminder: Enter each private school on it's own line or list each school and funds in budget descriptors.
- Pro Tip: Streamline administrative tasks and check nonprofit status in June before commencing services for 2020-2021 and before sending invitations for 2021-2022.
- Take Action: Make sure private school contact and DE1111 information is entered and updated annually.
- <u>Right Now: Send Participating EL #'s to GaDOE.</u>

PRIVATE SCHOOL OFFICIALS

- Suggestion: GaDOE encourages private schools to request digital language learning resources from the LEAs for ELs.
- Reminder: DE1111 Form format is updated annually and due within the first 30 days of school. The form should be updated if enrollment changes.
- Pro Tip: Keep business control ID handy for your private school or the business under whose nonprofit status the school is registered. Don't forget to maintain documentation showing the relationship.
- Take Action: Make sure GaDOE has the most current contact information on file.
