508 Compliance and Accessibility

Similar to how differentiated instruction is used to meet the needs of individual students and their specific learning needs, 508 compliance is important to ensure needs are met in regard to accessibility of resources, supports, communication, and information. The term "accessibility" describes how successfully a person with a disability or unique need can perceive, operate, and understand the information they want or need. This is where assistive technology comes into play. Assistive technology helps individuals with disabilities perform tasks that might otherwise be difficult or impossible.

Some examples of accessibility include:

- Utilizing the keyboard instead of a mouse to navigate a screen
- Utilizing a screen reader
- · Video captions or subtitles
- Text-to-speech options

Supporting Teachers with an Effective Data Analysis Model

Data is messy...confusing...time-consuming and sometimes just plain scary! However, data represents the most reliable measure of success and must be used effectively to ensure the greatest success for teachers and students. This session outlines a data action model designed by Daniel R. Venables that provides a systematic approach for reviewing and, most importantly, responding to data. It includes a series of five meetings which guide teacher teams through a friendly, systematic, and efficient process to review and respond to data.

The templates and protocols presented help deepen data conversations and delineate exactly what should be accomplished in each of the five meetings. Participants will be led through a discussion of each step taken within the model to ensure all are better equipped to put "Data into Action".
