

TEM Scoring Guide and Methodology

Components of the TEM

- The **Teacher Effectiveness Measure (TEM)** consists of two components: (1) Teacher Assessment on Performance Standards (TAPS), and (2) Student Growth. These two components contribute to the overall Teacher Effectiveness Measure (TEM) for each teacher.
- General Score Scale: Exemplary, Proficient, Needs Development, Ineffective
- **TAPS**-The TAPS component of TKES provides evaluators with a qualitative, rubricsbased evaluation method by which they can measure teacher performance related to ten quality performance standards that are scored from 0 to 3 (sum score can range from 0-30).

Final Ratings	TAPS Summative Cut Scores
Level I	0-6
Level II	7-16
Level III	17-26
Level IV	27-30

• Student Growth

• **Student Learning Objectives (SLOs)** – The measure of student growth for nonstate-tested subjects. The aggregate measure of SLO performance for all nontested courses taught by a teacher will be used in calculating his or her TEM.

Rating Levels	Student Results
Level I	< 50% High Growth and Expected Growth
Level II	\geq 50% and < 65% High Growth and Expected Growth
Level III	\geq 65% and < 90% High Growth and Expected Growth
	OR
	≥ 90% Expected Growth AND < 30% High Growth
Level IV	\geq 90% High Growth and Expected Growth AND
	≥ 30% High Growth
