

### AND ONE OF THE FOLLOWING

- Pass an End of Pathway Assessment (EOPA)/Industry Recognized Credentialing exam (if it applies)
- · Complete a pathway in an industry-certified program
- Earn at least one unit in a state-approved Work-Based Learning program in the concentrated pathway area
- Complete all components of the Career-Related Capstone Project in the concentrated pathway area, as outlined by the Ga DOE

### OR

 Via dual enrollment complete two Technical Certificates of Credit (TCC) in one pathwey, earning a Technical College Diploma, or earning an Associate's Degree (Senate Bill 2 requirements)

### Leadership Skills Seal

### Awarded to high school graduates who:

- Held memberships in a state-recognized Career and Techical Student Organization (CTSO) during high school
- Prepare a portfolio to include a cover letter, resume, and three letters of recommendation

### AND ANY 3 OF THE FOLLOWING

- Connect with local businesses to secure support for the student's local CTSO project (i.e. through sponsorship, judging at conferences, and/or in-kind donations, etc.)
- Advocate for local CTSOs by presenting to civic organizations, legislators, and/or local, state, or national board of education members
- Receive a regional, state, or national honor and/or recognition
- Participate in at least 40 hours of documented community service, and/or community service campaigns (i.e. March of Dimes)

### Distinguished Leadership Skills Seal

### Awarded to high school graduates who:

 Held a leadership office at the regional, state or national level in state-recognized CTSO during high school
