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The Importance of the Ag Local Plan

Agricultural Education

- * Maintains the integrity of the Ag-Ed model of instruction.
- * Insures all expectations are clearly defined.
- * Verifies that there is administrative support for the program.



The 3-Circle model of Agricultural Education integrates technical skill instruction through SAE and leadership development through the FFA. (Note that they are not extra-curricular.)



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Agricultural Education – FY13 Budget Information

- 1. Local CTAE Supervisors complete a Budget Information Request Sheet and please send it to the Ag-Ed Region Director By: April 2**
- 2. Ag Teachers complete the 2012 Program of Work Evaluation with the Ag-Ed Region Staff. By : May 2**
- 3. Ag Teachers complete the 2013 Program of Work on line. By May 2**
- 4. Ag Region Directors return an Approved Local Plan Budget File to the Local CTAE Supervisor. By: May 7**
- 5. Local CTAE Supervisor upload FY2013 Approved Local Plan Budget File to Consolidated Application. By: May 15**

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New Career Cluster Model

- Aligning with the Federal Career Cluster Model – and adding one pathway
- NO DRASTIC CHANGES (from the original Peach State Pathways)
- Allows for more local flexibility in providing pathways
- All pathways will have the same foundation course
- If Approved – these will be the Agricultural Education Pathways:

Agribusiness Systems	Food Products and Processing Systems
Animal Systems	Forestry / Natural Resources Systems
Diversified Agriculture and Agriscience Systems	Plant Systems
Environmental Systems	Power Structure and Technology Systems (Agricultural Mechanics)

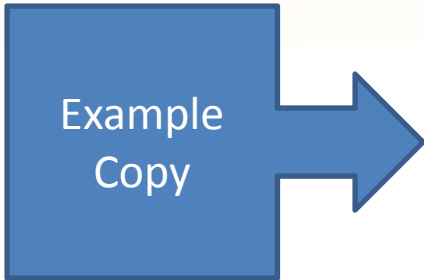


Agricultural Education Credentials for Students

- Career Development Events (CDE's) are industry recognized and supported, follow national standards, and are the best measure for student technical skill attainment. There is no cost for these exams.
- A list of all students from your school earning a credential during the 2011- 2012 school year is being compiled and will be sent to you in May 2012 by the Region Agricultural Education Director.
- The actual credential (document) will be given to your agricultural education teacher for delivery to the student.


