- 2. Ag Teachers complete the 2012 Program of Work Evaluation with the Ag-Ed Region Staff. By: May 2
- 3. Ag Teachers complete the 2013 Program of Work on line. By May 2
- 4. Ag Region Directors return an Approved Local Plan Budget File to the Local CTAE Supervisor. By: May 7
- 5. Local CTAE Supervisor upload FY2013 Approved Local Plan Budget File to Consolidated Application. By: May 15

- If Approved these will be the Agricultural Education Pathways:


