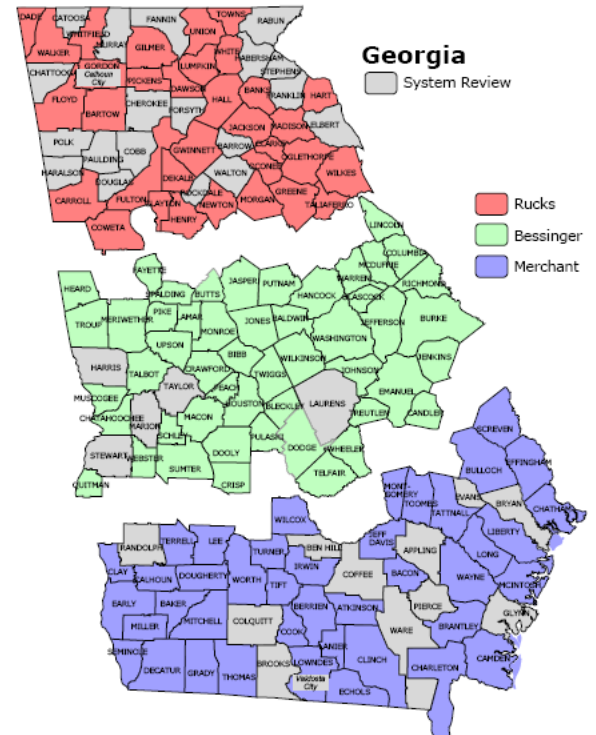

CAPITAL EQUIPMENT GUIDELINES

- You must have submitted an application via the Consolidated Application in May 2011 to receive funding in FY13 (2012-2013)
- If your system will need funding in FY14 (2013-2014), then you must submit an application in May 2012
- Please review the updated *Capital Equipment Facilities and Equipment Guidelines* located on the GaDOE website to become familiar with the grant requirements
- Requisitions for reimbursement of expenditures must be **submitted via GAORS within 90 days of the expenditure**, during the period of July 1st to June 30th, of the fiscal year. All requisitions for reimbursements must be submitted by July 31st 2013.



Please Review Initial Application Process (see Page 11 of Guidelines)

Making application for a CREQ Grant:

Phase One:

1. The initial application is made two years prior to opening the program via the Consolidated Application software (this request allows DOE to request lab funding from OPB). Completed applications are due by May 15 of the spring for programs that will open the following calendar year. (ex. May 15, 2012 for programs opening in school year 2013-2014)
2. Architectural plans for new construction or for modified construction of labs must be completed and submitted for approval to the GaDOE Facilities Services unit prior to making application for the Construction-Related Equipment grant. This is the same procedure as is used by school systems to obtain approval for any proposed new educational facility to be built.
3. Mandatory attendance of the Spring Regional Update Meetings for your region is required to be eligible to receive the CREQ Grant.
4. Go to the CTAE website at <http://www.gadoe.org/Curriculum-Instruction-and-Assessment/CTAE/Pages/Facilities-Capital-Equipment-and-Equipment-Lists.aspx>. Select Construction-Related Equipment Grants, Lab Designs and Equipment Lists. This web site will give you the most current information about the grant.
5. Contact the Program Specialist(s) for the lab area(s) that you are planning on adding or modifying. This individual can provide additional information or inform you of any changes taking place in their respective instructional areas.

Phase Two:

6. Applications are resubmitted/modified by May 15 of the second year via the Consolidated Application software (this request allows the State Board to approve lab funding). Resubmitted or modified applications are due by May 15 for programs that will open after June 30th. (ex. May 15, 2012 for programs opening in school year 2012-2013)
7. Any lab changes from **Phase One** request, must be completed and submitted for re-approval to the GaDOE Facilities Services unit prior to making application for the Construction-Related Equipment grant.
8. Mandatory attendance of the Spring Regional Update Meetings for your region is required to be eligible to receive the CREQ Grant.

Expenditures completed by June 30, 2012 for the above grants must be requisitioned and "Closed-Out" by July 31, 2012. Funds must be drawn-down and the system level Georgia Online Reporting System (GAORS) Completion Report done by July 31, 2012 to close each grant. Any funds not draw-down by then will be lost to the system. **Important:** If there are amounts in the "Balance Not Requisitioned" column after any grant has been closed out, this indicates that the funds requested and obligated by your system was not used; when this happens, these funds are lost for educational use. Although most systems expend all approved funds and need much more; returned funds have a major impact on the ability of the Department of Education to justify the request for additional funds that may be needed for future activities. Non Requisitioned federal funds will return to the state as carryover; however, funds returned in excess of 15% can result in a system receiving a "RISK ASSESSMENT MONITORING" visit based on federal guidelines of the Office of Management and Budget Circular (OMB A87). It is very important that future grant funds requested are expended for the activity agreed to in the application or released early in the fiscal year for reallocation to other systems.

FY2014**



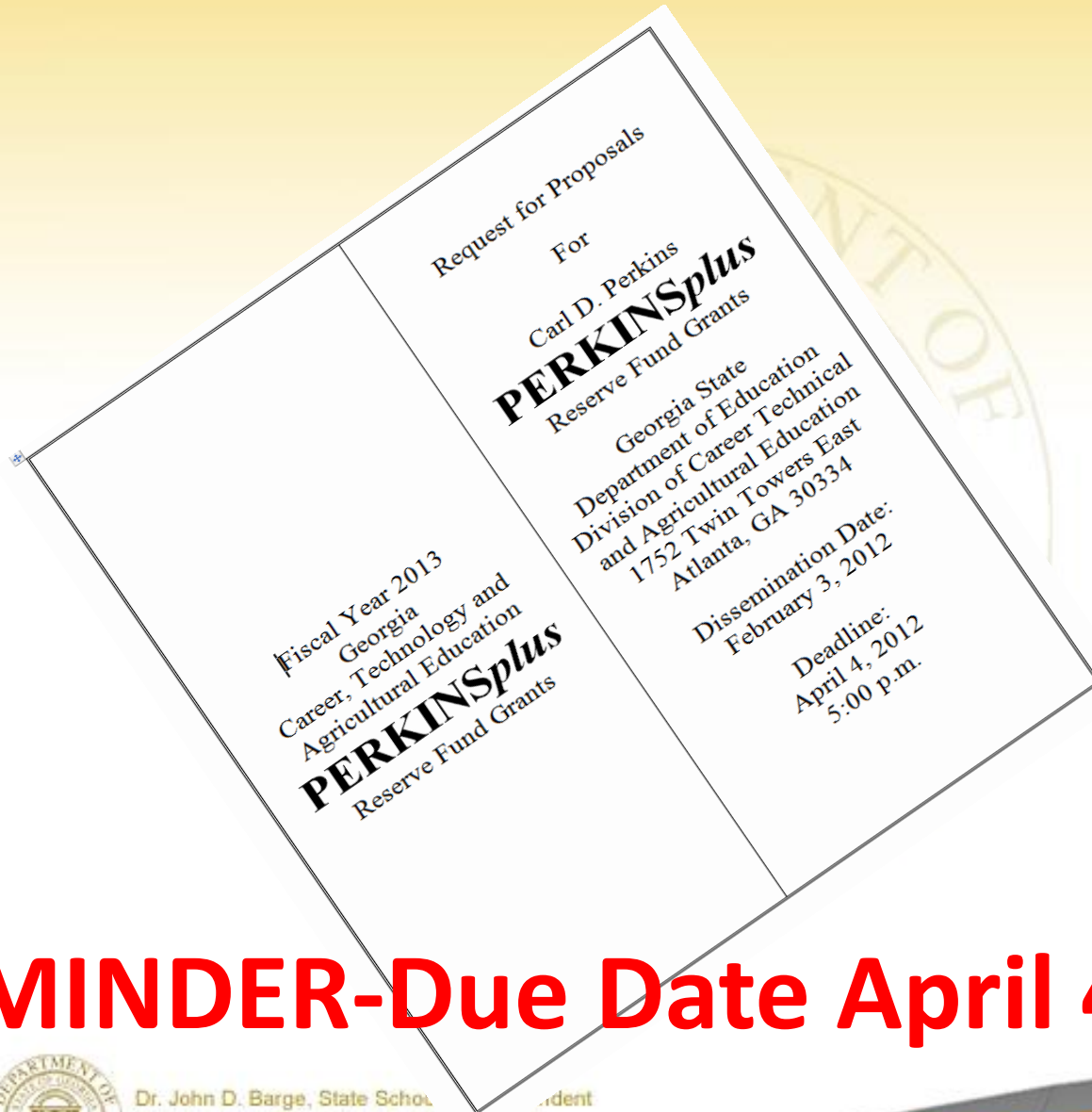
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PREPARATION FOR THE FY2014 REDUCTION
