- New course numbers are submitted for the next approval of the State Board Rule for approved courses (IDA(3) 29 May 2013 160-4-2-.20 List of State-Funded K-8 Subjects and 9-12 Courses for Students Entering Ninth Grade in 2008 and Subsequent Years).
- IDA with the newly added courses is approved by the State Board.
- Adopted courses are edited for posting on the website.
- When information is distributed ahead of the process it implies assumptions about the State Board's role in the process.

Construction Clarification

- It is not the policy of the DOE nor NCCER to require the removal of stationary equipment in our construction labs. You are not required to remove table saws, band saws, etc in order to become Industry Certified.
- The new Construction pathways only require three courses to be a pathway completer.

Collision Repair Change

- Mechanical and Electrical Components and Structural Analysis and Damage Repair will be discontinued after 14-15. Allow students already enrolled in MECI or SADRI to complete the pathway, but do not enroll any new students in those pathways!
- Students may choose Non Structural Analysis and Damage Repair or Painting and Refinishing. That is all.

Healthcare Courses - Important things to know:

- Any Healthcare Science course that includes a clinical component (excluding a shadowing experience field trip) must adhere to identified guidelines under (WBL) work-based learning (available at www.qadoe.org under WBL manual). There won't be as many requirements as for regular WBL. Training for the Healthcare Science teacher on these guidelines will be provided. Ex. Used with Patient Care Fundamentals (formerly called Nursing Essentials) which is our C NA course or Allied Health and Medicine (old course General Medicine)
- Will be called CMed separate, but similar to C NET
- Remember all but 3 of the 17 healthcare pathways have the same first two courses.
- New internship called Healthcare Clinical Practicum is planned (Not approved yet to replace the multiple internship courses.



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Students with <u>Significant Cognitive Disabilities</u> Assessed on Georgia Alternative Assessment (GAA)

- Pursue a career pathway that resembles general education pathways
- These courses should give students access to the regular education curriculum at an entry or prerequisite level
- IEP team determines the environment for instruction and level of support
- IEP team examines the course descriptions and course standards to determine an appropriate pathway
- Special Education Teacher analyzes course standards from each pathway course and decides which are appropriate
- Not expected to take EOPA because they are not mastering the regular education course standards at the same level of proficiency as general education students
- If students on GAA earn a regular diploma and earn credit in 3 pathway courses, then they are a pathway completer





Career Pathways for Students with Disabilities (Not Assessed on GAA)

- Meet all the same standards as another other student
- Complete a three course sequence pathway
- Students that master course standards (pass the course) will be expected to take the EOPA
- Receive accommodations not modifications
- <u>Prior</u> to placing a student in their chosen Career Pathway, IEP team should look at EOPA and which accommodations (if any) are allowed.
