The Good Behavior Game (GBG), a universal classroom behavior management method, was tested in first- and secondgrade classrooms in Baltimore beginning in the 1986–1986 school year. Follow-up at a page 19-21 found significantly lower rates of drug and alcohol use disorders, regular smoking, antisocial personality disorder, beingenery and in car eration for violent crimes, suicide ideation, and use of school-based services among students who had played the GBG. Serveral regulactions with shorter follow-up periods have provided smiller early results, (1) Evidence shows that Good Behavior Game benefits continue to accure in 2006, Holly Wilkiox, PhD discovered that children who played the Game were half as likely as young adults to report suicidal fhoughts and about a third less likely to report a suicide alternity.
