

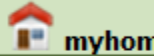

Georgia's College and Career Ready Performance Index

As of March 30, 2012, Georgia was one of only 10 states to have been granted a waiver from No Child Left Behind (NCLB). The waiver enables the state to hold schools accountable and reward them for the work they do in all subjects and with all students.

Georgia will begin using the College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI) next school year for state accountability purposes. The CCRPI has multiple indicators to determine a school's performance, rather than using a single test score given at one point in time.

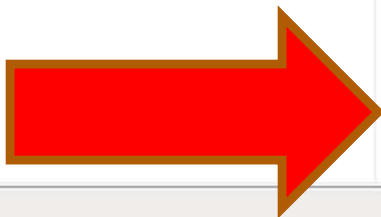

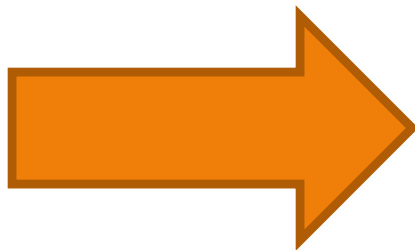

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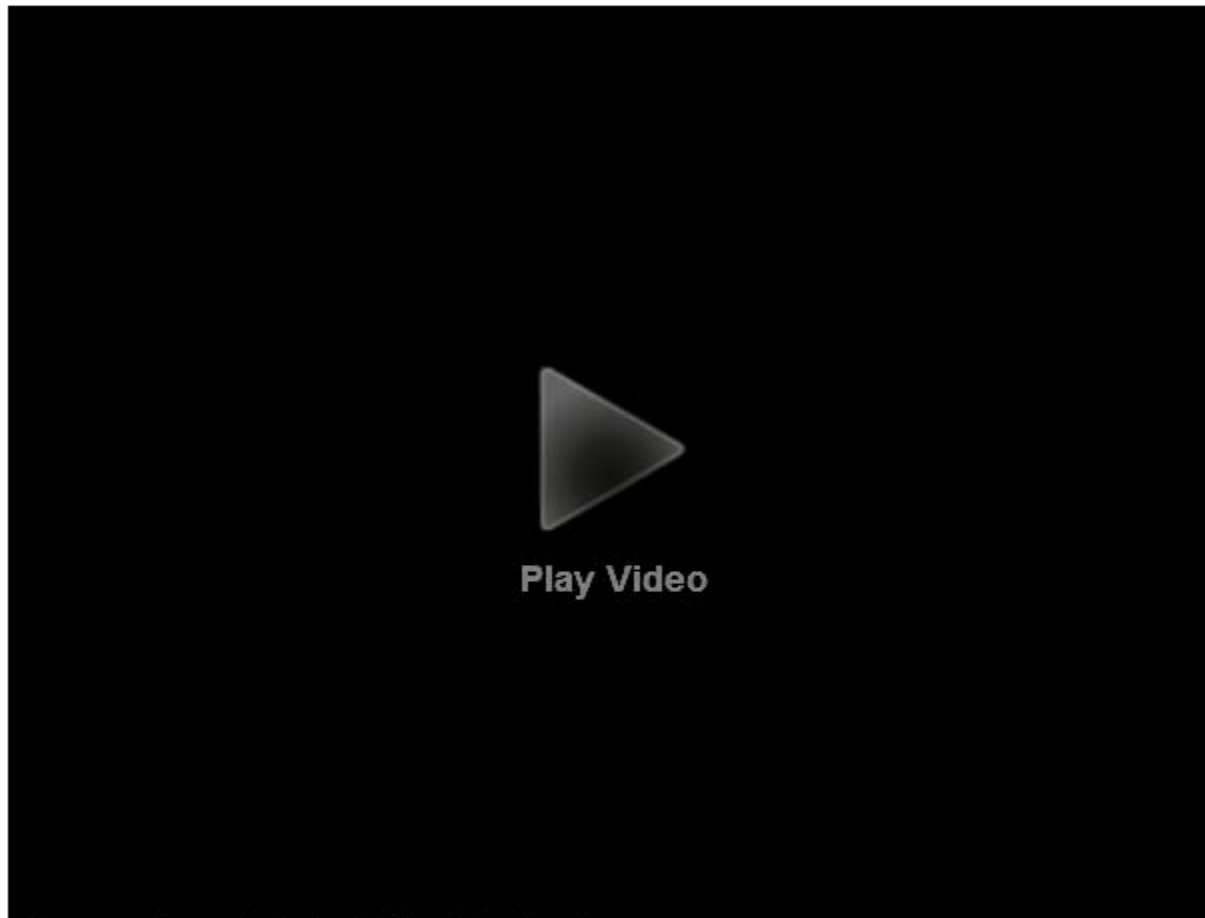

The OSHA Outreach Training Program is our primary way to train workers in the basics of occupational safety and health. Through the program, individuals who complete a one-week OSHA trainer course are authorized to teach 10-hour and 30-hour courses in construction or general industry safety and health hazard recognition and prevention. Authorized trainers can receive OSHA course completion cards for their students. Over the past three years, over 1.6 million students have received training through this program.

The OSHA Outreach Training Program is voluntary. OSHA does not require participation in this program.

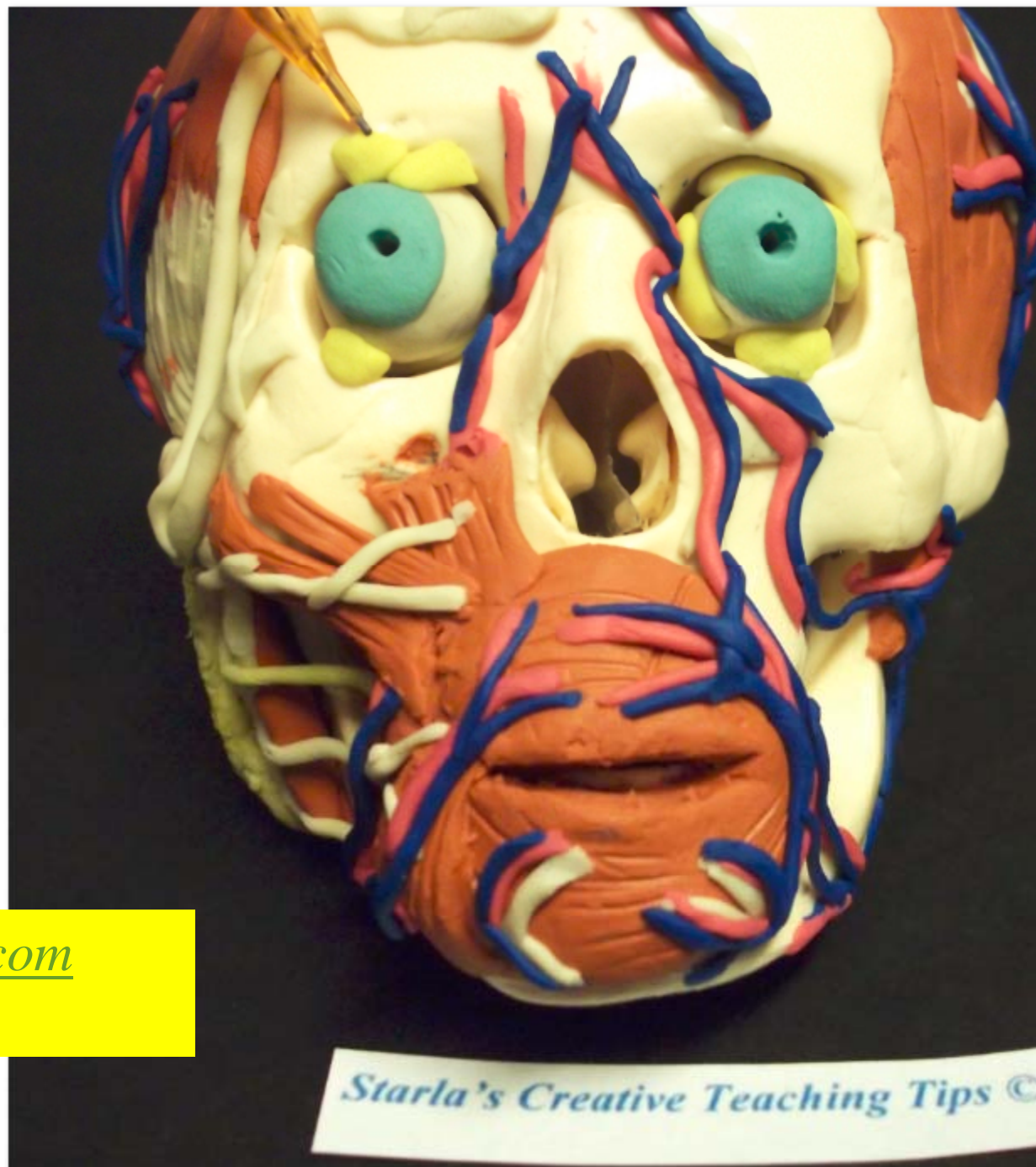

Status of Career Clusters and Curriculum Revisions

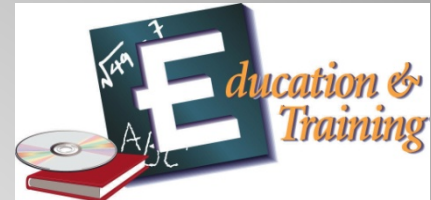
*Charts I will be showing are tentative – nothing has been decided yet

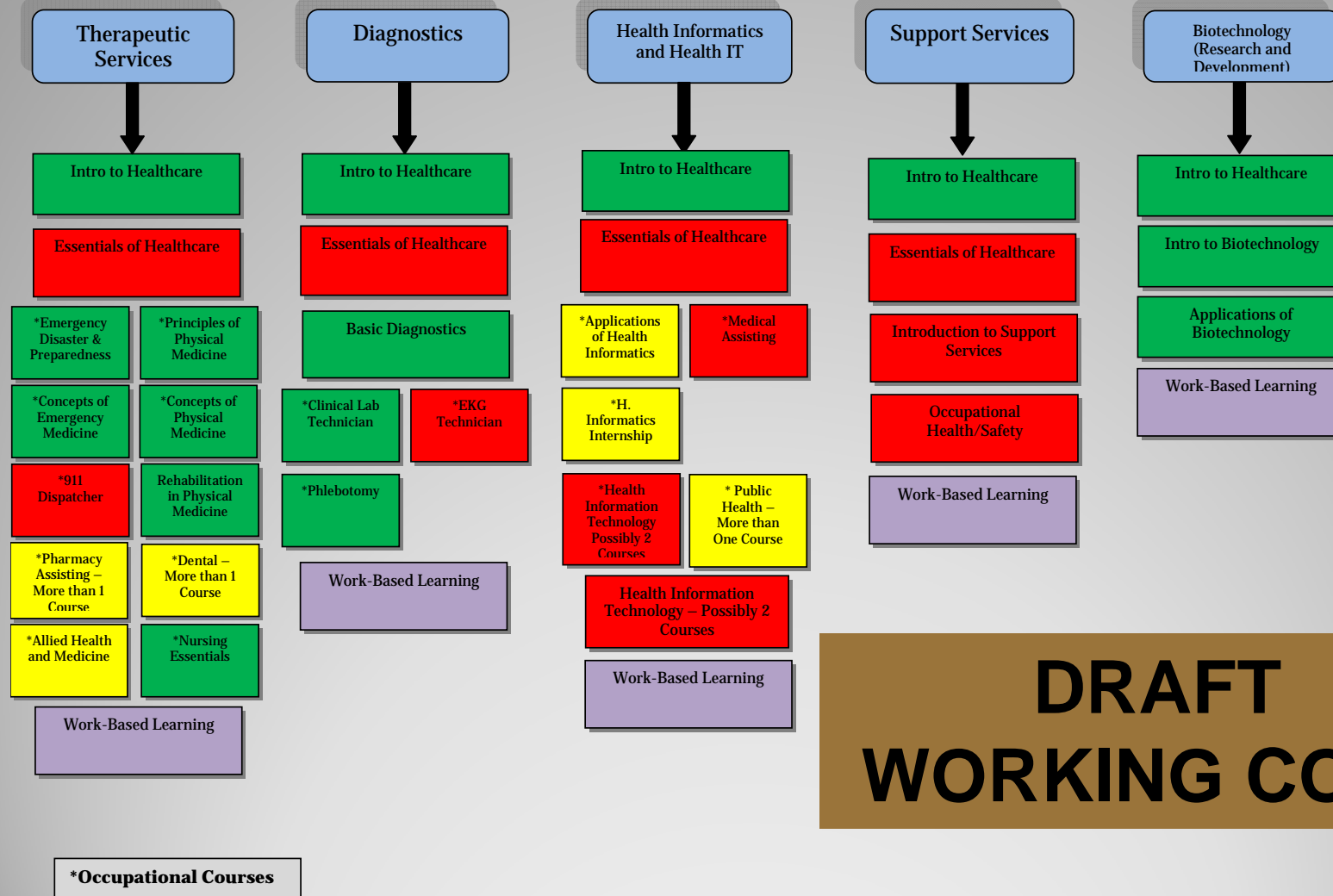

Healthcare Adds 32,800 Jobs In May

Healthcare added 32,800 jobs last month, an increase of 0.2%, to bring the industry's total employment to 1.43 million workers, new seasonally adjusted figures from the U.S. Bureau of Labor [Statistics](#) show. The U.S. unemployment rate increased to 8.2% from 8.1%, with the country's economy adding 69,000 jobs in May. For the year that ended in May, healthcare hiring totaled 340,100 jobs, for growth of 2.4%. Hospitals added 4,500 jobs to the payrolls last month, a 0.1% gain, for overall employment of 4.8 million. During the year that ended in May, hospital hiring grew 2%, or by 92,900 jobs. Physician office staffing increased to 2.4 million with the addition of 9,900 jobs last month, an increase of 0.4%. For the 12 months that ended in May, physician offices added 84,000 jobs, a gain of 3.6%.

The Big Push: Eight Years Remain To Satisfy BSN Recommendations

The Robert Wood Johnson Foundation and Institute of Medicine's report "The Future of Nursing: Leading Change, Advancing Health" calls for 80% of nurses to hold baccalaureate degrees by 2020, but is this goal attainable? Across the country, that answer varies, but the push to bring the numbers upward is happening in individual states. The RWJF and IOM report recommended increasing the proportion of nurses with bachelor's degrees from the current national average of 50% to 80%.

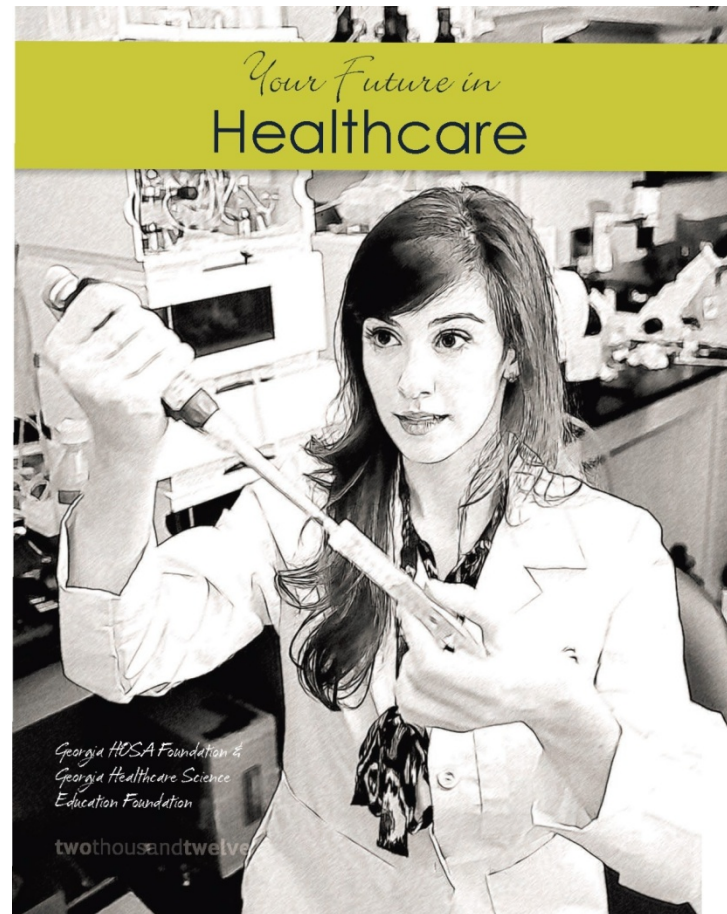

Fig 1: Healthcare and Social Assistance Industry Jobs

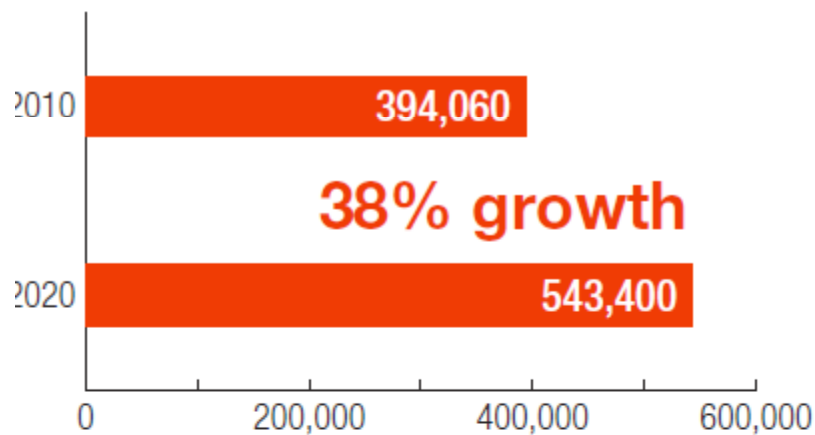
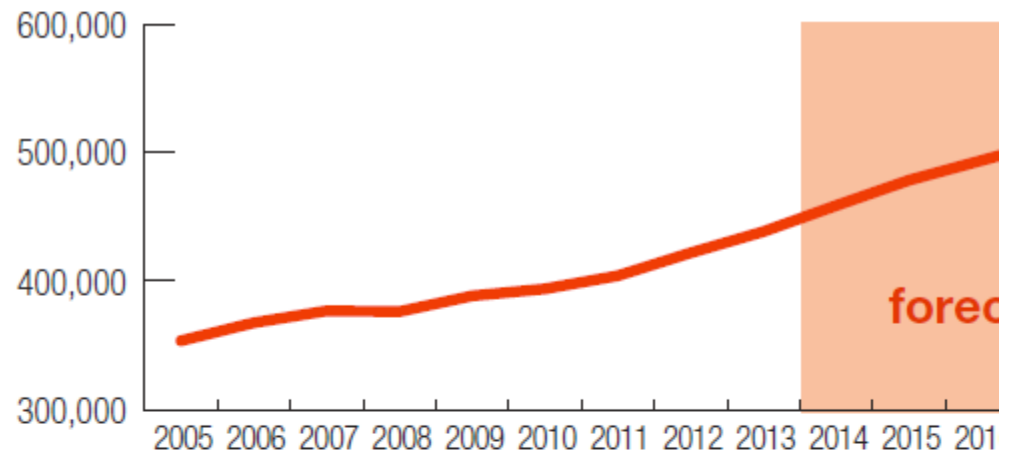


Fig 2: Health Care and Social Assistance Employment
