Move On When Ready

All 8th-11th grade students must receive general Move On When Ready information by April 1 each year as required by HB 186.

Attention Junior and Senior Students

What is Move On When Ready (MOWR)?

- MOWR is a dual enrollment opportunity for students to attend a postsecondary institution full-time during their junior and/or senior year of high school.
- Students will receive high school credit and college credit simultaneously while attending college classes full-time on the college campus.
- Approved college on-line courses can also be taken that meet high school graduation requirements.
- MOWR provides high school students the opportunity to "jump start" postsecondary education during the high school years.
- High school students will be free to "move on" earlier to the next educational level.
- Students will have an educational alternative other than the traditional high school setting or school day structure.
- Students can save money on future college costs since most expenses are paid as a part of local school system funding.
- Students must have attended a Georgia public high school the prior year and counted in both FTE counts.

How to participate in MOWR:

- **First**, contact and meet with the high school counselor to discuss the guidelines and responsibilities of the program
- Student and parent must sign-off Participation Permission Form
- Be and stay on track for high school graduation
- Select approved courses taken at the college level that meet the high school graduation requirements
- Meet the admission requirements of the selected college/university
- Have attended a Georgia public high school *full-time* the prior year (full year)

What Else Do You Need To Know?

- 1) Tuition, materials, fees and possibly books are paid through MOWR funding. Food, transportation and other costs are the responsibility of the student
- 2) Students can live on campus only with college approval but the student is responsible for expenses related to these costs
- 3) Georgia public high school End of Course Tests and any other state required assessments or graduation requirements must be met
- 4) Classes do not count against the HOPE Scholarship or Grant hours
