

Career and Technical Education in Georgia

Secondary CTE programs are offered through comprehensive high schools and career academies, which are typically schools-within-a-school. Postsecondary CTE programs are offered through the Technical College System of Georgia, which consists of 25 technical colleges with 2 university system technical divisions and 31 satellite campuses.¹

Perkins Performance Indicators (FY 2016)


Congress made accountability for results a central focus of Perkins IV. States are required to report annually on the following core performance indicators, which assess their effectiveness in achieving statewide progress in CTE and optimizing the return on investment of federal funds in CTE.²

Career Cluster Enrollment (FY 2016)

Seven of the 16 career clusters in CTE lead to high-skill, high-wage, and high-demand STEM-related careers (Agriculture, Architecture, Health, Information Technology, Manufacturing, STEM, and Transportation, Distribution, and Logistics) and contain programs that prepare students for nontraditional careers.²
