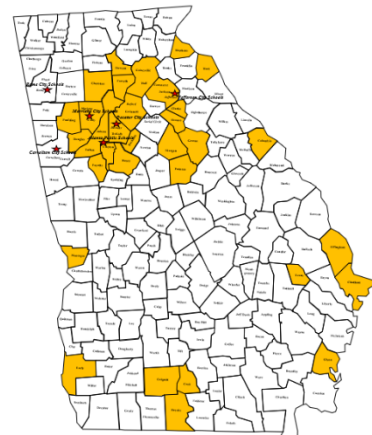

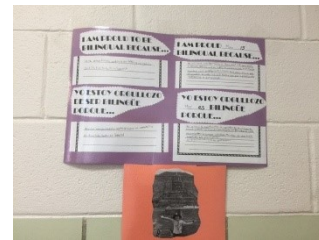


- [Fourteen students and two teachers from Riverwood International Charter School traveled to Spain this summer](#) for a total language and culture immersion experience. The group spent 17 days in Barcelona, Seville, and surrounding areas as part of the third year of Riverwood's Spanish language and culture study abroad program. The students lived with local families and attended a local school in Seville. According to Riverwood Spanish teacher Lorraine Lynch who led the trip for the third consecutive year, "Total language and cultural immersion is essential to building global citizens. To fully experience a language and culture as 'locals' do offers students a first-person experience which is not possible in the confines of a classroom." The program was offered in conjunction with Centro MundoLengua, a private language school and educational tour operator. Lynch and Riverwood International Baccalaureate (IB) teacher and World Language Department Chair, Donna Vargas, accompanied the Riverwood students, who ranged in age from 10 th grade to recent graduates.

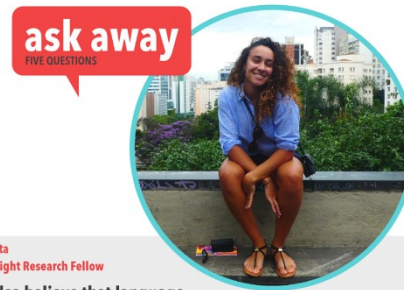
