Related to the Biliteracy Seal

- Official Results from the first reporting cycle have been tabulated and 549 Seals were issued by the first reporting deadline of May 1st. 417 in Spanish, 92 in French, 29 in German, 4 in Chinese, 1 in Latin and 6 others in other European Languages from 14 reporting districts. Since the AP and IB exams are the primary pathway to the Seal, we have a 2nd reporting deadline of Sept 1st to recognize those students that qualify for this historic seal via their results. Let me encourage your schools and systems to recognize those students that qualify retroactively for the seal. This will mean something for their future lives and it is important for us to recognize their efforts and abilities. Especially so as language ability is a rising workforce priority for our nation.
- A reminder that I have updated the reporting procedures for schools and systems for the <u>Seal of Biliteracy</u>. Biliteracy Seal requests can now be made via an online form accessed <u>here</u>. This is also accessible via our website. When your school or system is ready to report your seal requests prior to the 2nd reporting deadline of Sept 1st, simply submit via this form and we will confirm the request via email.
- o On July 21st, Delaware became the 27th state to offer a seal of <u>Biliteracy</u>.

Related to the International Skills Diploma Seal

- With this school year, the International Skills Diploma seal is entering its third year of implementation in the state of Georgia. Georgia is 1 of only a handful of states that recognizes students with a seal of global competence for graduating seniors. Participation is up 30% from last year with 80 high schools now offering the seal in 28 Georgia systems. A number that has been steadily rising since inception. 640 International Skills Diploma Seals were awarded last year.
- O I have also recently updated the reporting procedures for the International Skills Diploma Seal as well. Again, the intent is to simplify the reporting and application procedures, systems and schools can now report qualifying students via an online form here. Additionally, I have added an additional form for ISDS schools or systems wishing to request that courses be considered for pre-approval on the home page here. A reminder, the application process is now open and will be open through December 15th of 2017. The application along with the rubric the committee used to evaluate these applications are available via the website. I want to encourage schools and world language programs to offer this important Seal and of course I am ready to assist in this process as requested.

• Related to DLI (Dual Language Immersion)

There are over 4,000 Georgia students learning via the dual language immersion model in Georgia. Recently, a newly publicized abstract by renowned immersion researchers Thomas & Collier, entitled <u>Validating the power of bilingual schooling:</u> 32 year of <u>Large-Scale Longitudinal Research</u>, reaffirmed these advantages. Data collected by districts on these programs as well as supporting data at the state level supports these findings as well.
