Georgia's Systems of Continuous Improvement



Georgia's ESSA plan outlines how the Georgia Systems of Continuous Improvement will be the common, multi-tiered framework for supporting children and schools in our state.

What is the CLIP?

- Consolidated LEA Improvement Plan (CLIP)
- GaDOE is required to collect plans that define how LEAs will support their students when accepting federal funds under The Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) of 2015.
- The CLIP outlines how LEAs will coordinate all of their supplemental federal fund sources to meet identified student needs in the district.
- The Georgia Systems of Continuous Improvement is the common framework that GaDOE uses to communicate with LEAs about their coordination efforts.

C&I Updates: Standards Review Process

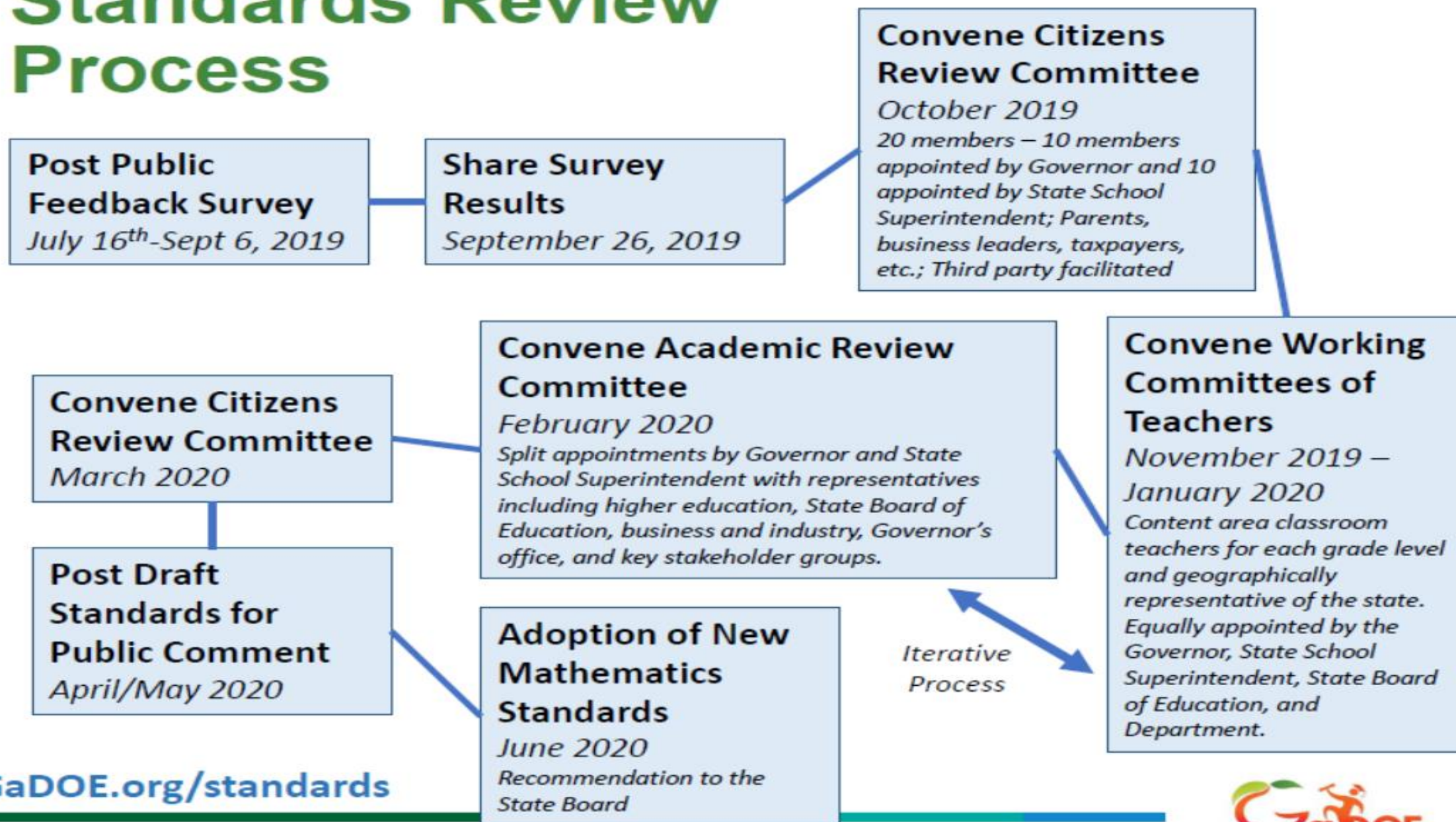
Background

- **Summer 2019:** Governor Kemp announced he was partnering with the State School Superintendent to review/revise ELA/mathematics standards
- **Standards Review/Revision Cycle:** Every 4-5 years
- Mathematics standards will be addressed first, then ELA standards
- Establish a Citizens Review Committee

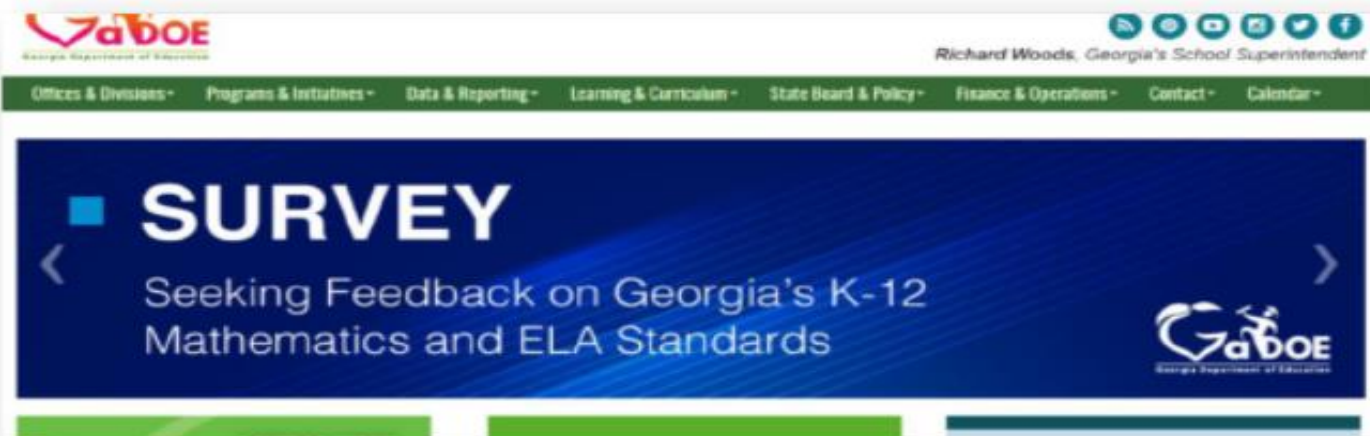
Standards Review Process



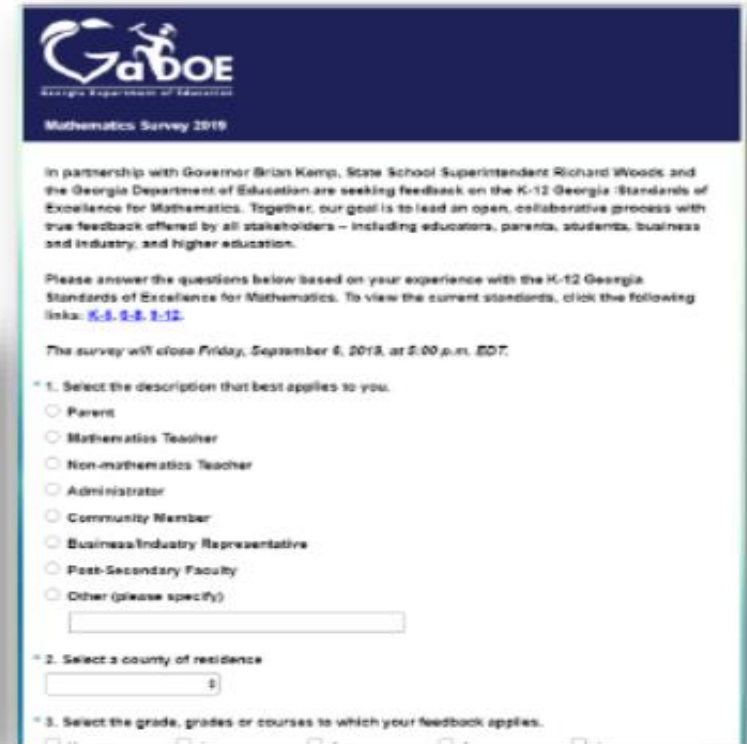
