Focus on Family Strengths

 Identifying family strengths is critical to engaging families as partners in their children's education. To identify and make use of family strengths, educators may need to shift from a deficit-based model, which focuses on what families are not doing, to a strengthsbased model, which acknowledges that families want to help their students succeed (Moore, 2011).
