Benjamin Banneker High School opened in 1988 as a result of a merger between M.D. Collins and Feldwood High School. Banneker HS was identified among the lowest-performing five percent of Title I schools in the state over a three-year period and received priority school designation in 2015. Current enrollment is 1,570 and 100% of students are economically disadvantaged. Additional demographical information includes:

✓ Grades: 9-12

✓ Student Diversity: 94% Black, 2% White, 4% Other

✓ Students with Disabilities: 15.8%

Schools within the shared geographic area of Banneker have one of the lowest child well-being scores in the state of Georgia as reported by the United Way of Greater Atlanta. The city of College Park was recognized as the third most dangerous city in the state of Georgia in 2019 and the second in 2018. Despite many challenging factors, Banneker has undergone a transformation that includes an increase in student academic achievement, a decrease in the number of discipline incidents and is on track to closing the graduation gap.




Table 2: Graduation Rate




Table 3: Georgia Milestones End of Course Exams




Table 4: Number of Distinguished Learners (Students Scoring 92%+ on Georgia Milestones Exams)




Table 5: Discipline




Table 6: Teacher and Staff Vacancies (Post 10-Day Count)





Table 7: Advanced Placement Access and Passage Rates
