Supporting Digital Learning



- Professional learning is critical
- Consider increases the number of staff to ensure teacher feel supported using technology
- Develop strategies to support new learning models
- Don't think about digital learning as just a contingency option

Digital Access for all students



- Ensure an adequate number of devices are available for all students
- Work to ensure equitable access for all students to digital resources
- Involve community partners to ensure that broadband is available for all
- Consider the amount of bandwidth required to support digital learning (streaming media, etc.)
- Don't forget training – especially for parents (young learning will require their help)

Empowering teachers using data



- Digital Literacy training for all staff; data-informed decision making
- Work with your technology staff to identify digital data sets that support classroom instruction
- Seek formative assessment tools that provide data immediately usable by teachers
- Parents appreciate seeing data that support learning goals

Cybersecurity and Data Privacy



- Cyber criminal activity is at an all time high. Schools are “low hanging” fruit and considered to be prime targets.
- Students and their data are particularly vulnerable
- The increased use of digital resources must be accompanied with professional learning
- Require good “digital citizenship” for all students
