

# Overview and Identification

## **Unaccompanied Youth**



#### **Definition of Homeless Students**

#### □Individuals whose nighttime residence is NOT:

- □ Fixed—stationary, permanent, and not subject to change
- Regular—used on a predictable, routine, or consistent basis
- Adequate—sufficient for meeting both the physical and psychological needs typically met in the home(42 U.S.C.§11434A(2)(B)(i))

Can the student go to the SAME PLACE (fixed) EVERY NIGHT (regular) to sleep in a SAFE AND SUFFICIENT SPACE (adequate)?



The Homeless definition includes children and youth who are:

- Sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or similar reason;
- Living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or camping grounds due the lack of alternative accommodations;
- Living in emergency or transitional shelters;
- Abandoned in hospitals;



**Definition of Unaccompanied Homeless Youth (UHY)** 

Unaccompanied = not in the physical custody of a parent or guardian; in practical terms, this means the youth does not live with the parent or guardian.

#### **2-Step Process:**

- 1. Does the student's living arrangement meet the McKinney-Vento Act's definition of homeless?
- 2. Once homelessness is determined, is the student unaccompanied?



## UHY Flow Chart

- Unaccompanied youth have the same rights as other students experiencing homelessness.
- Unaccompanied youth have run away from home, been thrown out of their homes, and/or been abandoned by parents or guardians. These young people are separated from their parents for a variety of reasons:
  - Over half report being physically abused at home
  - Over one third report sexual abuse
  - Over two-thirds report that at least one of their parents abuses drugs or alcohol



## **Data Collection**

ENVIRONMENT CODE indicates the type of residential environment in which a student resides or the type of school the student attended at anytime during this school year at this school. Code only those students for whom one of the codes below apply. For students where codes do not apply, leave blank.

Environment Code	Description
1	Resides in a local institution for neglected
2	Resides in a local institution for delinquent
3	Homeless
4	Unaccompanied Homeless Youth

## **Foster Care**

#### Are UHY who are in foster care eligible for McKinney-Vento?

McKinney-Vento eligibility should be considered on a case-by-case basis:

- Foster youth with a fixed, regular and adequate residence: NOT ELIGIBLE
- □ Foster youth without a fixed, regular and adequate residence: ELIGIBLE
  - i.e. Youth ran away from placement and is not in a fixed, regular and adequate residence
  - i.e. Youth fleeing domestic violence in the foster care home
  - i.e. Youth displaced due to natural disaster/fire at foster care home
  - i.e. Youth who age out of the foster care system
- □ In a given school year, youth identified as MV eligible prior to entering foster care: **ELIGIBLE**



## **Reporting to Child Welfare**

# Are you a mandated reporter?

Liaisons should make reports consistent with state law when there is a reason to suspect abuse, neglect, and/or that a student is in danger.



## HB530 and ILP Students In Care



## HB530

#### Effective July 1, 2019

Prohibits parents or guardians from withdrawing or removing a child from a public school for the purpose of avoiding compliance with laws relating to mandatory attendance, school discipline, parental involvement, or parental responsibilities.



# Independent Living Program (ILP)

ILP provides funding and support to help youth successfully transition from foster care. To be eligible you must meet one of these conditions:

- □Age 14 to 21 in the foster care system regardless of their permanency plan
- □Under 21 and was eligible for IL services when DFCS placement authority ended
- Between the ages 21 and 25 and enrolled in college, technical school or a training program



## **ILP Services**



- □ Education: Youth acquire training and educational opportunities that lead to post-secondary education
- □ Employment: Youth are assisted in searching for employment opportunities and receive education on how to generate income to support themselves
- □ Housing: Youth have access to safe, stable, appropriate, and affordable housing in the community near public transportation
- Health: Youth are guided in managing affordable health insurance for mental, physical, and dental needs
- Supportive Relationships: Youth have in place supportive relationships that are able to assist them with obtaining services throughout the community for the purposes of achieving personal goals



## **UHY: Who Can Sign?**

#### Barriers

- Extracurricular activities
- Fieldtrips
- Medical services
- □School absences
- Additional school programming

#### Solutions

Federal law does not require LEAs to take a unified approach in resolving signature barriers

Liaisons should consult with their legal counsel on how to create internal policies that will remove roadblocks to educations for UHY

# **Targeted Outreach and Engagement Strategies**



Post outreach materials where youth congregate (parks, clubs/ organizations, libraries, etc.)



Develop outreach materials targeted specifically to youth. (NCHE Webpage)



Include contact information for the local liaison in all outreach materials.



Use youth-friendly means of communication. (Websites, email, text, social media)





Make the school a welcoming and supportive place.





# School Engagement Strategies



- Review and revise policies to assist with accumulating credits toward graduation
- Provide access to showers and laundry facilities
- Familiarize key personnel with laws regarding minor medical consent
- □ Familiarize key personnel with laws regarding mandated reporting of suspected abuse or neglect, or a runaway



## School Engagement Strategies



- Notify school nutrition when unaccompanied youth enrolls
- Provide flexibility with school assignments, especially those with supplies needed
- Familiarize key personnel with eligibility for local social service and housing programs


