

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### CAPS & Head Start: A Tale of Two Acts...



## **Child Care and Development Block Grant Act of 2014:**

- CCDF Final Rule
- Requires States to....
- Oversight from the Lead Agency (DECAL)
- Promotes flexibility for States to develop high-quality child care programs that best suit the needs of children and families as they pursue financial selfsufficiency and school success for their children.

#### **Head Start Act of 2007**

- Head Start Performance Standards
- Requires local programs to...
- Oversight from Regional Office (Region IV Office of Head Start)
- Promotes the school readiness of low-income children by enhancing their cognitive, social, and emotional development.

# Shared priorities Do you see the common threads?



#### **CAPS**

- Families with very low income as defined by CAPS
- Families who lack fixed, regular, and adequate housing
- Families participating in or transitioning from TANF
- Children in Georgia Division of Family and Children Services (DFCS) custody

### **Head Start**

- Families who are lowincome at or below poverty line
- Children who are homeless
- Families who would be eligible for public assistance; including TANF child-only payments
- Children in foster care



- We lack awareness of who and where these priority families are in our landscape.
- Families experiencing homelessness can be highly mobile which makes outreach and recruitment a challenge.



### Barriers we must take into consideration



- Families experiencing homelessness often do not have vehicles or access to transportation.
- Families experiencing homelessness often lack documents required for enrollment which may result in enrollment being delayed or denied.
