

Rationale for Forming a Regional LEA Consortium

- Under ESSA, Title III, Part A statute does NOT permit the state to allocate subgrants of less than \$10,000.
- Title III, Part A English Learner funds are allocated on a per EL student basis,
- Allocations are calculated yearly using March FTE-3
 EL Student Count.
- Typically, 60-85 EL students could equal the \$10,000 minimum
- In FY19, 125 districts in GA did not have enough EL students to meet the minimum grant requirement.



Benefits of Forming a Regional LEA Consortium

Receive supplemental federal funds to provide:

- 1. Additional language instruction educational programs for English Learners,
- 2. EL-related professional learning for their teachers; and
- 3. Additional outreach activities for their parents.

Receive technical assistance and support from GaDOE's Title III, Part A specialists for ways to help EL students be successful in learning school English.



Then & Now....

Previous Statewide Consortium Solution

- All Non-Title III Districts became one large statewide consortium managed by the state
- State decided what each LEA could or could not have (student resources, PD, parent activities, etc.)
- Not all District's needs could be met – inflexible!

Current Regional LEA Consortium Solution

- Districts choose to form and/or join a regional consortium of like-minded LEAs
- Districts have flexibility to spend regional consortia grant funds to support their own EL students', teachers', and parents' needs with grant guidelines.



Title III, Part A Regional LEA Consortia: Flexibility-Driven

Title III-A program plans specific to District needs.

Flexibility is gained – supporting LEA goals!

IMPORTANT!

- We will not know next year's ACTUAL allocation amounts until APPROVED by the SBOE in July, 2019.
- It is ALWAYS POSSIBLE that districts 'on the cusp' of \$10,000 this year could move into "INDEPENDENT" status next year!
- BE PREPARED for this possibility. Have a backup plan. (Would the LEA consortium disband? Would different LEAs be sought out for membership, in order to meet the \$10,000 minimum?)
- You MUST plan for this eventuality BEFORE submitting the Letter of Intent to the state by March 31, 2019.

- ☐ Begin Regional LEA Consortium contract (Use sample or create your own)
- ☐ Submit Letter of Intent to GaDOE Federal Programs, Title III, Part A by March 31.

April-May 2019

- ☐ Each Consortium member should identify their own EL Needs/Plans in LEA CLIP/DIP
- ☐ **Final** <u>copy</u> of LEA Consortium MOU due to GaDOE Federal Programs, Title III, Part A by May 31.



Questions to Consider

1. Who would like to partner with me?

- Title III Allotment (group of LEAs must total > \$10,000 for '18-'19 allocation)
- Regional proximity
- School calendars
- Philosophy on EL education
- Unique resources partner LEAs could offer
- Ideal # of partner LEAs

Planning Timeline for FY20 Regional LEA Consortia (cont.)



Summer 2019

- ☐ Begin budget planning with your anticipated group allotment.
- ☐ Coordinate & draft the LEA Regional Consortium "Title III-A EL Program Plan" that will be submitted with the FY20 budget.

October 1 2019

☐ FY20 Title III, Part A EL Program Plan and LEA Regional Consortium **budget due** in ConApp (Submitted by Lead LEA, as <u>fiscal agent</u> for the consortium.)

(Maintain documentation of plan implementation throughout the year.)

May 2020

☐ Collaboratively compile data and prepare narrative for annual Title III, Part A Annual Self-Reporting Instrument

Due June 1 from Lead LEA (fiscal agent)



Questions to Consider

As you review the sample LEA Consortium contract, discuss the following:

- Who would be responsible as the lead LEA?
- How would the group collaborate to develop the Title III Program Plan and CLIP?
- Would Title III PD be planned and held as a consortium group or individually?
- How would purchasing be handled?
- Determine responsibilities for annual Title III data gathering and reporting to GaDOE.
